Any objection to the Order must be made in writing, stating the grounds of the objection, and addressed to the Minister of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 11th day of January, 1954.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to arrange for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

Any owner or occupier of any land to which the Order relates may send to the Bracknell Development Corporation at the address below a request in writing to serve him with a notice that the Order has been confirmed, and naming a place where a copy of the Order and the map and of any descriptive matter annexed thereto, may be seen. Such request should contain a statement of the name, postal address and the interest in the land of the owner or occupier, and particulars sufficient to enable the extent and boundaries of the land to be identified.

**ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930. SECTION 46 (1).  
ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933.  
SECTION 29 (4).**
