(c) at least three years' service in a builder's general office and experience in estimating, costing, management, followed by a further three years' experience as Site Foreman or General Foreman.

Civil Engineering Inspector (Grade 111). (1) Candidates must be at least 28 years of age on 1st January, 1954.

or

(b) the Intermediate City and Guilds Certificate

(c) the first class certificate of the Worshipful Company of Carpenters in Building Construction and Sanitary Science, or

(d) the Licentiate Diploma of the Institute of Builders.

They must also have had an apprenticeship in a building trade and three years' experience as Foreman or Chargehand either on general building works of construction or maintenance or on the preservation and restoration of ancient and historic structures.

Technical Assistant (Grade III) {Maintenance Surveyors Branch).

(1) Candidates must be at least 25 years of age on 1st January, 1954.

(2) Candidates must have obtained :-

(a) the Ordinary National Certificate in Building, or

(b) the City and Guilds third year Certificate in Building, or (c) the Licentiate Diploma of the Institute of

In addition they must have had five years' training and technical experience with a building surveyor or building contractor.

Quantities, or (b) the Ordinary National Certificate in Building,

or

(c) the Licentiate Diploma of the Institute of Builders, or

(d) they must supply proof of professional study to an equivalent standard.

They must also have had five years' training and experience with a quantity surveyor or building con-tractor (or government department or local autho-A candidate for mechanical and electrical rity). engineering services should possess comparable engineering experience.

Quantity Surveying Assistant (Grade IV). (1) Candidates must be at least 21 years of age on 1st January, 1954.

(2) Candidates must have had at least three years technical experience with a quantity surveyor or build-ing contractor or a lesser period if coupled with an approved course of training at a recognised school. A candidate for mechanical and electrical engineering services should possess comparable engineering experience.

Sanitary Officer (Grade III).
(1) Candidates must be at least 25 years of age on 1st January, 1954.
(2) Candidates must have obtained the First Class Final City and Guilds Certificate in Plumber's Work plus the City and Guilds Certificate in Sanitary and Domestic Engineering, plus seven years experience in plumbing either as a plumber or an apprentice to a plumber; or equivalent or better qualifications

such as "M.R. San. I." having passed the Royal Institute's examination in 'Sanitary science as applied to public buildings', plus seven years' experience in building sanitation, essentially including large multi-storey buildings.

Land Surveying Assistant (Grade III). (1) Candidates must be at least 21 years of age

(2) Candidates must have had at least three years' approved training and experience, and must have passed the preliminary examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (Sub-Division 5 Land Survey), or equivalent, and must pass the Inter-medicate Examination or equivalent within two wards mediate Examination or equivalent within two years of the date of appointment.

Estate Surveying Assistant (Grade III). (1) Candidates must be at least 22 years of age on 1st January, 1954.

Artist Craftsman (Grade III). (1) Candidates must be at least 25 years of age on 1st January, 1954. (2) Candidates must have had a good education, normally to the standard of the General Certificate of Education least of Education (Ordinary level), and have had good training, either at a school of art or as apprentice to a craftsman in metalwork. They must have had first rate experience in one or more of the following:

(a) Painting in various mediums and the clean-

ing and restoration of painting. (b) Cleaning, repair and preservation of objects of archaeological interest, such as pottery, coins. weapons and tools for museum display. (c) Repair of iron and bronze work of antique or

classical design, chiefly of a monumental character.

Time and Materials Assistant (Grade IV). (1) Candidates must be at least 25 years of age on 1st January, 1954. (2) Candidates must possess sound elementary edu-cation with English and arithmetic to the "credit" standard of the Royal Society of Arts, Stage 1 (Elementary).

They must have at least three years' experience on a building site or in a builder's office or with a firm of mechanical and electrical engineers, and possess an adequate knowledge of building (or engineering) materials and of the elements of construction.

Technical Assistant (Grade III) (Supplies Division). (1) Candidates must be at least 23 years of age on 1st January, 1954.

on 1st January, 1954. (2) Candidates must have had five years' experience in the provision and/or manufacture of furniture in wood or metal, and knowledge of the materials used in the trades. Exceptionally, consideration will be given to candidates who have knowledge and experience of the furnishing trade only, but for a

experience of the furnishing trade only, but for a very limited number of posts. They should have served with firms capable of giving them all round experience (not confined to salesmanship) and should preferably have studied at a recognised Polytechnic or Institute and have gained knowledge of traditional furniture.
