WAGES COUNCILS ACTS, 1945 TO 1948.

PAPER BAG WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by the Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1951 (Order P.(50)), as amended by the Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1953 (Order P.(54)), (2) the revocation of Order P.(50) and Order P.(54), and (3) the amendment of the Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order, 1948 (Order P.(44)).

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of Section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Minister of Fuel and Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, he has granted to

D'Arcy Exploration Co. Ltd., Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, E.C.2, three prospecting licences, details of which are given in the schedule below. The boundaries are described from the 1 inch Ordnance Survey map, supplemented where necessary by reference to the 6 inch Ordnance Survey map.

Maps showing boundaries of the areas may be inspected on application to the Ministry of Fuel and Power, Petroleum Division, Thames House South, Millbank, S.W.1.

SCHEDULE.

1. *An area of 192 sq. miles in the Counties of Southampton, Surrey and Sussex.*

A description of this area was published in the London Gazette of 19th November, 1935, and 27th April, 1937.

2. *An area of 193 sq. miles in the County of York. Northern Boundaries.*

From Monckton Moor Bridge the boundary follows the road through Bishop Monkton and Roecliffe to Boroughbridge. Thence it follows the road through Great Ouseburn, Newton upon Ouse, Shipton, Rawcliffe and Haxby to Towthorpe.

Eastern Boundary.

From Towthorpe the boundary runs south along the road to Huntington, then east to the junction with A64 at Stockton Hall Lodge. It continues along A64 to Hopgrove Farm and proceeds by Hopgrove Lane, Holtby Lane, Bad Bargain Lane and Outgang Lane to Osbaldwick. Thence it follows Osbaldwick Lane and Mill Lane to Heslington and Fulford whence it proceeds to Naburn by way of B1222. Here it crosses the river Ouse at Naburn Ferry and proceeds along the north bank of the river through Ancaster Malbis to Intake Lane, which it follows past Nova Scotia and across an air-field to Ancaster Lane and thence to Acaster Selby.

Southern Boundary.

This follows the road through Appleton Roebuck, Bolton Percy and Tadcaster to the junction with the railway north west of Newton Kyme Station. From here it follows the railway through Wetherby, and Spofforth to the The Stray, Harrogate.

Western Boundary.

This proceeds through Harrogate by way of York Place, Knaresborough Road and Skipton Road till it meets A61 which it follows through Killinghall to Ripley. Thence it runs along the road east and north to Wormald Green where it meets the railway which it follows to the commencement of the northern Boundary.

3. *An area of 188 sq. miles in the County of York (E. & W. Ridings).*

Northern Boundary.

From the junction of A162 and A64 in Tadcaster the boundary follows the road through Bolton Percy and Appleton Roebuck to Acaster Selby. Thence it runs north along the road to Acaster Malbis to Naburn whence it follows the railway to the junction with Moor Lane. It continues along Moor Lane and Naburn Lane through Skipwith to the junction with A163 at New Houses, North Duffield. Continuing along A163 the boundary runs through Bubwith to the cross roads approximately 300 yds. N.W. of Highfield Station. Here it turns in a south easterly direction along the road through Willtoft and Spaldington to Sandwood House and on to the junction with A614 at Ivy House. Thence it follows A614 to Drain Bridge whence it follows Drain Lane to Market Weighton Canal at Sod Houses.

Eastern Boundary.

This follows Market Weighton Canal to Weighton Lock.

Southern Boundary.

The boundary follows the High Water Mark of Medium Tides from Market Weighton Canal to the landing stage at Earnshaw's Warming Drain. Thence it runs along Winfeet Road and over Old Goole Bridge to the junction with A161 and A614 in Goole. It continues along A614 to the junction with A645 which it follows to Snaith Railway Station. Thence it follows A1041 through Camblesforth to Pears, Bridge where it turns west along the road to Burn Grange. From
