Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 20th day of November, 1953, to delegate to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and the Earl of Harewood, or any two or more of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval of anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of May, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Rockbourne and the benefice of Whitsbury, both situate in the diocese of Winchester.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Rockbourne and the benefice of Whitsbury shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Rockbourne with Whitsbury', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* The union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the benefice of Rockbourne if the incumbent at that time of the benefice of Whitsbury shall have been instituted to the benefice of Whitsbury subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, or if instituted before that date shall, with the approval of the bishop, consent to become the incumbent of the united benefice but if he shall have been instituted to the benefice of Whitsbury before that date and shall not so consent, or if the bishop shall

not approve, then the union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said benefice of Whitsbury following such avoidance of the benefice of Rockbourne and the then incumbent of the said benefice of Rockbourne shall become the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* (a) Without prejudice to the exercise, before the date when the union shall take effect, of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Whitsbury shall, if at that date it so belongs, be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice pending the provision of a more suitable house therefor.

"(b) Upon the date when the union shall take effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Rockbourne, if at that date it so belongs, and upon the provision of a more suitable house as aforesaid the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Whitsbury, if at that date it so belongs, and the sites and appurtenances of the said houses and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

"(c) So much of the net proceeds of the sales of the said houses as, after consultation with the bishop for the time being of the said diocese, we shall deem sufficient shall be applied by us towards the cost of providing or acquiring a more suitable house as the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice as aforesaid and any balance of the said net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Winchester established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"4. *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation to the united benefice after the union has taken effect the patron of the benefice of Rockbourne shall have the first and third turns and the patron of the benefice of Whitsbury shall have the second turn.

"5. *Diversion of Endowments.* Upon the union taking effect a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely a capital sum sufficient to produce a sum of £110 per annum upon the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, being part of a larger capital sum at present held by us on behalf of the benefice of Rockbourne, shall be severed and diverted from the benefice of Rockbourne and from the united benefice and shall be transferred to and become vested in us to be held as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Winchester as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of

Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas an Appeal against the said Scheme has been made to Her Majesty in Council by Commander A. R. F. Purvis, Patron of the said benefice of Whitsbury, and such Appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on the 28th day of October, 1953:

And whereas the said Appeal against the said Scheme to Her Majesty in Council stands dismissed for non-prosecution:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf affirm the said Scheme and order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Hildenborough, Tonbridge, Shipbourne, and Hadlow all in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Hildenborough, Tonbridge, Shipbourne and Hadlow shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Hildenborough comprising:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Tonbridge which lies to the northwest of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Tonbridge from the parish of Leigh at the point opposite the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of field numbered 1 on the said map and

continuing thence first northwards to and then generally northeastwards along the boundary of the Urban District of Tonbridge to the boundary which divides the parish of Tonbridge from the parish of Hildenborough.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Shipbourne comprising:—

"All that part (coloured green on the map) of the parish of Tonbridge which lies to the north of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Tonbridge from the parish of Hildenborough at the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 861 and continuing thence first southeastwards then northeastwards and then southeastwards along the boundary of the Urban District of Tonbridge to the boundary which divides the parish of Tonbridge from the parish of Hadlow.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Tonbridge comprising:—

"All that part (coloured blue on the map) of the parish of Hadlow which is bounded on part of the south by the parish of Capel, on the remaining part of the south and on the west by the parish of Tonbridge and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Tonbridge from the parish of Hadlow at a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of close numbered 76 and continuing thence first northeastwards to and then in a clockwise direction along the boundary of the Urban District of Tonbridge to a point in the middle of the River Medway opposite the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 762 and continuing thence southwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and northeastwards in continuation thereof along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the last mentioned close to a point opposite the middle of the northwestern end of an unnamed brook or stream which divides close numbered 760 from close numbered 764 and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned brook or stream (thereby crossing close numbered 761) and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the boundary which divides the parish of Hadlow from the parish of Capel."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that Guy Henry Tristram of Newlands Farm, Boars Head, Crowborough, Sussex, a Major (retired) in Your Majesty's Army, is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice but it is thought that David Ralph Tristram of 108, St. James Street, Dublin, Eire, Vere Ronald Krohn of 'Amroth', Hillside Road, Burnham-on-Crouch, Essex, Thomas Jennings Wallace of Furley, near Membury, Axminster, Devon, and Joan Mary Crofts of The Old House, Caythorpe, near Grantham, Lincolnshire, may have some legal interest in the said advowson:

"And whereas the said Guy Henry Tristram desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice, and the said David Ralph Tristram, Vere Ronald Krohn, Thomas Jennings Wallace, and Joan Mary Crofts also desire to transfer their respective interests therein (if any) to the Bishop of Chichester for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Chichester for the time being."

"SCHEME.

"Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme) we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution

"(a) As from the day of the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area, approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Philip and Saint James, Chatham'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.

The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Rochester and in the rural deanery of Rochester.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts of the parish of Saint John, Chatham, and of the parish of Christ Church, Luton (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which are bounded on the west by the district of Saint Stephen, Chatham, on part of the south by the parish of Aylesford, on further part of the south by the parish of Boxley and on the remaining part of the south by the parish of Bredhurst and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the point on the boundary which divides the parish of Bredhurst from the parish of Christ Church, Luton, in the middle of Ham Lane 5 chains or thereabouts southwest of its junction with Capstone Road and continuing thence generally northwestwards along the middle of Ham Lane and Shawstead Road to a point opposite the middle of the footpath leading to Lords Wood Lane and continuing thence to and then along the middle of the last mentioned footpath and in the same line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Lords Wood Lane and continuing thence northwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the middle of the footpath leading to Princes Avenue and continuing thence generally westwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to its end and continuing thence first westwards to and then northwards along the middle of Princes Avenue to a point opposite the southern end of the footpath passing on the northwestern side of the house and premises known as Keppel and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to its junction with the footpath leading to Mill House and continuing thence along the middle of

the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts and continuing thence northwards in a straight line to the southeastern end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of close numbered 601 and continuing thence northwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and in the same straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the footpath leading to Street End Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to a point opposite the middle of the last mentioned road and continuing thence first northwards to and then north-eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the southeastern end of the footpath leading to Magpie Hall Road and continuing thence generally northwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to its junction with the footpath leading to Walderslade Road and continuing thence westwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Luton, from the district of Saint Stephen, Chatham."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Scheme is published in the London Gazette the parish of Saint John, Cranford, and the parish of Saint Andrew, Cranford, shall, with the consent, testified by his signature hereto, of the Reverend Percy Grandfield Phillips, now incumbent of the united benefice of Cranford Saint Andrew with Cranford Saint John, forthwith be permanently united together and form one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Parish of Cranford'.

"2. *Parish Church.*—The parish church of the parish of Saint John, Cranford, shall be the parish church of the united parish.
