

Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Little Marlow, Loudwater and Wooburn shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Little Marlow being:—

"(1) All that part of the parish of Loudwater (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the southwest of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Loudwater from the parish of High Wycombe (otherwise Chipping Wycombe) in the middle of the road leading from Wycombe Marsh to Princess' Gorse opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of close numbered 494 (on the map) and continuing thence first southeastwards to and then generally in a southeasterly direction along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of close numbered 495 to its junction with the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of close numbered 491 and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence first southeastwards and then northeastwards along the northern boundary of closes numbered 491 and 490 to its junction with the wall or fence which divides close numbered 487 from closes numbered 490 and 492 and continuing thence generally in a northerly direction along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 482 to its end and continuing thence generally in a southeasterly direction along the southwestern boundary of the wood known as 'Fennell's Wood' (numbered 402 on the map) to its end and in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Treadaway Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Treadaway Road to its junction with Treadaway Hill and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Treadaway Hill to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of close numbered 423 and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in a straight line eastwards across close numbered 421 to the southwestern end of the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of close numbered 420 and continuing thence first northeastwards then northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of close numbered 407 and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the boundary which divides the parish of Loudwater from the parish of Wooburn.

"(2) All that part of the parish of Wooburn (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded upon the west by the parishes of Little Marlow and Loudwater and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Loudwater from the parish of Wooburn in the middle of the railway line of the Wycombe Branch of British Railways (Western Region) and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the said railway line to a point opposite the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 205 and continuing thence first westwards to and then generally westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of close numbered 184a and continuing thence first southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence then southwestwards and then northwestwards along the wall or fence forming the southeastern and southwestern boundaries of the last mentioned close to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of close numbered 184 and continuing thence generally in a southwesterly direction along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence first southwestwards to and then southeastwards along the middle of White Pit Lane to a point opposite the northeastern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of close numbered 252 and continuing thence first southwestwards to and then generally southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 252

and continuing thence generally southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of close numbered 251 and continuing thence first westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 251 and continuing thence generally southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of close numbered 251 and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 8 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from Wooburn Green Station to Blind Lane and continuing thence first southwestwards then generally northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to its junction with Blind Lane at the southwestern corner of close numbered 248 (thereby skirting the southwestern boundary of Ronald Wood and the northeastern boundary of Wilfrid Wood) and continuing thence first northwestwards to and then southwestwards along the middle of Blind Lane to a point opposite the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of close numbered 245 and continuing thence first northwestwards to and then generally northwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of close numbered 244 to the boundary which divides the parish of Wooburn from the parish of Little Marlow."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf ratify the said Scheme and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the twentieth day of November, 1953, to delegate to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and the Earl of Harewood, or any two or more of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval of anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of April, 1954, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Ilkeston and Holy Trinity, Ilkeston, both in the diocese of Derby.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:
