Sinigard, May 9. The Duke of Wirimberg marched yesterday with all the Forces under his Command towards Reutlingen, where he is to be joined by several Duch Battalions, and by the Imperial Regiment of Cassel. The Elector of Bavaria and the Marshal de Marfin, with the Frenco and Bavarian Forces under their Command, came the 17th Instant into the Neighbourhood of Ebingen, where they encamped on both fides of the Danishe; They are (according to their own Account) 16000 strong, and seem to have a Design of marching further to meet the Succours they expect from Alface.

Asset inbourg, May 10. Prince Lewis of Baden is on his departure from hence, to put himself at the head of the Imperial Army. His Highness has sent Orders to the Margrave of Bareith to march with all his Forces toward G. istingen, and to General Thungen to post him-self at Fridlingen The French and Bavarian Army encamped the 5th Instant near Ulm, and are since advanced towards Bergen and Ehingen, where they continue encamped, and (as is believed) will not march any further till they fee what Progress the Marshal de Tallard

makes with the Reinforcement he is to lead thither.

Mastricks, May 14. The French have continued cantoned in their Lines till the 12th Instant, when they drew together in a Body, and encamped at Helesbem; and we have Advice this morning, that they marched yesterday to Marinaken, on this side Sr. Iron: They are getting together all the Boats they can at Namur, which they load with Cannon, Ammunition and all other Warlike Stores, and give out, that they delign to be-frege Huy, though it is believed they will hardly at-tempt it; and that they make these Preparations rather to hinder or delay the March of our Forces Into Germany. A Detachment of Troops, under the Command of Brigadier-General Ferguson, will march from hence to morrow towards the Moselle; and his Grace the Duke of Marlborough, having concerted with the Generals here the necessary Measures for opening the Campaign, intends to follow the 18th, and on the 18th will join all the English Troops at Bidbourg, near Cologne, and continue his March from thence to Coblemz.

Hague, May 16. N. S. The States General received
