of the said benefices shall be vacant the union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the two benefices; and if upon that day neither of the said benefices shall be vacant the union shall take effect upon the first avoidance of that one of the two benefices which shall last be avoided after that date.

"3. Parish Church. The parish church of the parish of Saint John, Upper Edmonton, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"4. Registers. After the union has taken effect with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Saint John, Upper Edmonton.

"5. Parsonage House. Without prejudice to the exercise before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measure, 1938, the parsonage house at present beof any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measure, 1938, the parsonage house at present be-longing to the benefice of Saint John, Upper Edmon-ton, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint Mary, Edmonton, together with the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith may be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, for a nominal consideration to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese of London, on trust, to be used as a house of residence of any curate and lay worker or other clerical or lay assistants employed by the incumbent to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice and if not so sold within such period as we, after consultation with the Bishop of London, may determine shall be sold by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of any such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of London established pursuant to the said Measures. "6. Patronage. After the union has taken effect

"6. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Saint John, Upper Edmonton, having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"7. Taking down of church.

"(a) IAs soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the church of Saint Mary, Edmonton, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and re-strictions imposed by the said Measures.

"(b) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said church of Saint Mary, Edmonton, shall not be sold, but shall in accordance with the provi-sions of the said Union of Benefices Measures and as the Bishop of the diocese may direct be transferred to the church of Saint John, Upper Edmonton, being the parish church of the united benefice, or to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Mary, Edmonton, or such of them as the Bishop shall select, shall be removed to the parish church of the united benefice or to any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the Bishop may direct, or shall be sold. shall be sold.

"(c) The net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be applied by us first in payment of such an amount as we, after consultation with the bishop for the time being of the diocese, shall deem necessary towards the cost of adapting the parsonage house at present belonging to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Edmonton, as a house of residence of a curate and lay worker or other clerical or lay assistants as aforesaid and the balance (iff any) of such net proceeds shall con-stitute and form part of the said Expenses Fund of the diocese of London.

"8. Provision for a curate or curates and lay worker.

"(a) Upon the union taking effect the incum-bent shall employ a curate and a lay worker or such other clerical or lay assistance as the Bishop of London may from time to time direct to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice. (b) A part of the endowments of the united

benefice, namely an annual sum of £124 being part of a larger annual sum at present payable part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us to the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Saint John, Upper Edmonton, shall upon the union taking effect be appropriated by us as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid, and the income of the said fund shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese of London as trustees to apply the same accordingly."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Bene-fices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisa-tion Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:
