PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

The Minister of Fuel and Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of the above Act and the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, he has renewed for a further period of twelve months two oil prospecting licences granted to the D'Arcy Exploration Co. Ltd., Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, E.C.2, in respect of

(1) an area of 1150 sq. miles in the counties of Chester and Lancaster.

(2) an area of 188 sq. miles in the county of Lancaster.

Civil Service Commission, 28th May, 1954.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT ENGINEERS IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

1. *Age.*
Candidates must be at least 17½ and under 23½ years of age (a half-year equals six calendar months) on 1st March, 1954. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st March, 1954;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular or regular short-service engagement may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st March, 1954, up to a maximum of two years;

(c) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they have spent in such service before 1st March, 1954.

2. *Sex.*

Men only may compete.

3. *Nationality.*

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.
