THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (LOAD LINE CONVENTION) (NICARAGUA) ORDER, 1954.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 24th day of June, 1954.

PRESENT,

The QUIDEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by section 65 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 9), it is enacted that Her Majesty, if satisfied that the government of any country has acceded to the Load Line Convention, may, by Order in Council, make a declaration to that effect:

And Whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the Government of Nicaragua has acceded to the Load

Line Convention:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Her by the aforesaid section and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased

1. It is hereby declared that the Government of Nicaragua has acceded to the Load Line Convention.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Load Line Convention) (Nicaragua) Order, 1954, and shall come into operation upon the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

called 'the said benefice') of Humberston in the county and diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Right Honourable Peter Alexander Rupert, Baron Carrington, of the Manor House, Biedlow in the county of Buckingham is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice:

"And whereas the said Peter Alexander Rupert, Baron Carrington, desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in

time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer

will tend to make better provision for the cure of

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Maurice, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and the product of the product of the same bishopric and shall thereupon. and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being."
