prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Wallsend; Saint Luke, Wallsend; and Long Benton, in the diocese of Newcastle.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution:

"(a) As from the day of the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual pumposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of Church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint John, Wallsend.'

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:
"The district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Northumberland and in the rural deanery of Tynemouth.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The area comprising:-

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts (shown by the blue, green and pink colours respectively on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Wallsend; Saint Luke, Wallsend; and Long Benton which taken together are bounded on the east by the parish of Willington, on part of the north by the parish of Killingworth, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point (in the neighbourhood of the Old Coal Shaft) on the boundary which divides the parish of Killingworth from the parish of Long Benton where the present Wallsend Urban District Boundary leaves the said boundary in a southwesterly direction and extending thence first generally southwestwards and then generally westwards and then generally southwards along the wards and then generally southwards along the said Urban District Boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Long Benton from the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and continuing thence first southeastwards and then southwards along the last-mentioned and then southwards along the last-mentioned boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Long Benton from the parish of Walker and continuing thence first southeastwards and then generally northeastwards along the last-mentioned boundary and the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Wallsend, from the parish of Walker to the point where it diverges southwards from the brook or stream known as Wallsend Burn and continuing thence generally northeastwards along the middle of Wallsend Burn wards along the middle of Wallsend Burn (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Luke, Wallsend, from the parish of Wallsend) to its junction with an unnamed brook or stream in the neighbourhood of Wallsend Viaduct and continuing thence generally northeastwards (passing to the west of the ruins of Holy Cross Church) first to and then along the middle of the said unnamed brook or stream to the boundary which divides the parish of Wallsend from the parish of Willington."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied

And where the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Newcastle.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of June, 1954, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril, Archbishop of York (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of All Saints Pavement with Saint Peter the Little and Saint Crux, York, and the benefice of Saint Saviour, York, both situate in the diocese of York.

"1. Union of Benefices and Parishes. The benefice of All Saints Pavement with Saint Peter the Little and Saint Crux, York, and the benefice of Saint Saviour, York, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United benefice of All Saints Pavement and Saint Crux with Saint Saviour, York', and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical property. purposes.

"2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Angelo Raine if he is then incumbent of both of the said benefices shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice, and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the two said benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him.

"3. Parish Church. The parish church of the parish of All Saints Pavement with Saint Peter the Little and Saint Crux, York, shall be the parish church of the waited parish

church of the united parish.

"4. Registers, The marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Saint Saviour, York, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books of baptism and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of the united parish." parish."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been
