

(Point B) and (iii) the public right of way running from the junction with Right of Way No. 502 at Point C through Ordnance Survey Field No. 52 in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 680 feet to Point E to a line running from the junction with Right of Way No. 502 at Point C through Ordnance Survey Field No. 52 in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 450 feet to junction with a further Right of Way at Point D. The old path will be closed as from the 31st July, 1954.

The Order becomes operative as from the 23rd July, 1954, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
