

Mules belonging to the Elestor of *Bavaria*, and got a considerable Booty. They were from *Sturgart* of the 30th, that *Prince Lewis* had in vain endeavoured to come to a Battle; but the Enemy having still avoided it, and having been favoured therein by the Situation of the Country, was marched towards *Eiberach*, intending to advance from thence towards *Ulm*, and the River *Iler*. *Prince Lewis* was thereupon marched from *Stutach* to *Gratzwisen*, within a League and half of *Sigmaringen* on the *Danube*, and on the 28th pursued his March from thence towards *Riedlingen*, in order to observe the Enemy's Motions. The *Marshall de Tallard* is marching with the *French Army* under his Command towards our Lines at *Buhl*, and was on the 28th past advanced within two Leagues of *Offenbourg*: He has a Bridge of Boats over the *Rhine* at *Reimau*, near *Strasbourg*: It is not yet known what he designs to undertake.

*Hague, June 6. N. S.* The *States Army* commanded by *Monieur d'Auverquerque* decamped the first Instant, and marched that day and the following night towards the Enemy, who were surprised in the morning to find our Forces in sight, and endeavoured to possess themselves of a considerable Post near *Tongeren*; but being prevented in that Design, and unwilling to hazard coming to an Engagement, they were forced to march about to get into their Lines, which they did at *Jax*: *General Dopff* at the same time perceiving them to be in some Disorder, advanced with 30 Squadrons of Horse and Dragoons directly towards the French Lines by the shortest way, and finding them but slightly guarded, forced them near *Walligue* with little Opposition. He remained in that Post near 3 hours, and sent Advice of what he had done to *Monieur d'Auverquerque*, who thereupon called a Council of War, wherein it was resolved, That seeing the Enemy, with a superior Force, might fall upon *Monieur Dopff's* Detachment before the rest of our Army could get up to support him, it was not advisable for him to continue in that Post; which Resolution being sent to him, he quitted the Lines, and rejoined the Army. The French have ever since continued very quiet in their Lines. Great Numbers of their Men desert daily, 100 being come over in one day; and they all report, that the Enemy have been reduced to great Straits for want of Provisions. Our Army encamped in the Plain of *Borchworm*, and it is believed will march towards *Breda*, to favour the Design upon *Sandvliet*, and some other Posts the Enemy has on that side; in order whereunto a Body of our Forces is drawing together between *Bergenopzoom* and *Steenberg*. *General Hagel* is made Governor of the *Dutch Flanders*, and of *Sluce*, where *Baron Spar* is to command during his Absence. The last Letters from the Army commanded by the *Duke of Marlborough* are dated the 2d Instant; his Grace was then at *Weinheim*, and intended to pass the *Neckar* the day following. The *Marshall de Villery*, with his Detachment was the 2d at *Thionville*, and intended to pass the *Musele* at *Waierdilligh*.

*Dublin, May 26.* This day came in here Her Majesty's Ship the *Advice*, Captain *Solomon Morrice* Commander, and under her Convoy the *Hannah* and *Alice*, and the *Mary Ann*, both of this Place; the *Favour* and the *Concord*, both of *Whitehaven*; and the *Rachel* and *Rebecca* of *London*; all laden with *Wine*, *Oyl*, *Fruit* or *Salt*, from *Lisbon*, whence they came in Company of a considerable Fleet of Merchant Men and Transport Ships, convoyed by two more of Her Majesty's Ships, which put into *Plimouth*. These Ships met in their Passage 3 French Privateers, and the *Advice* took one of them, of 18 Guns and 125 Men, 4 of whom were killed, and 16 wounded; 3 of the latter are since dead of their Wounds. The Prize was sent into *Plimouth*.

*Plimouth, May 29.* Yesterday the *Prince Eugene* Privateer of *Flushing* brought in here as Prize the Adventure Flyboat of *Nants*, of about 200 Tuns, laden with *Wine* and *Brandy* for the *West-Indies*, which he took the 26th Instant on the French Coast: The Prisoners taken on board this Prize report, That they came out of *Port Louis* the 25th, in Company of 3 other Merchant Ships, and 2 Men of War, which sailed directly to *Cadiz*; That the 3d a Squadron of French Men of War from *Brest*, with some *Vicaguallers*, sailed for *Cadiz*; and on the 9th French a Frigate of 54 Guns, which came from *Cadiz*, struck on a Rock at the Entrance into *Brest*, and was flung to pieces.

*Plimouth, May 30.* Yesterday came in here a *Flushing* Privateer of 16 Guns, with a French Prize of 22 Guns, called the *St. Mary*, of *Bourdeaux*, laden with *Sugar* and *Indico* from *St. Domingo*.
