And whereas we consider that revised rules, such as are already in force for officers of the rank of Captain, R.N. and below, should be instituted to govern the pay of officers of Flag rank while un-

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve that:

"(i) Naval Officers of Flag rank (excluding Admirals of the Fleet), while unemployed between appointments, shall receive the full pay of their rank, together with Marriage Allowance or Lodging

Allowance as appropriate, and Ration Allowance or Lodging Allowance as appropriate, and Ration Allowance: "(ii) Officers of the rank of Admiral of the Fleet whilst unemployed shall nevertheless, and notwith-standing the provisions of Order in Council dated the 3rd day of June, 1954, continue to receive the rate of half pay laid down in Schedule I, Section I to Order in Council dated the 30th day of January, 1952. 1952:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

## " SCHEME

"(4) There shall be transferred to the rural deanery of Sherborne within the archdeaconry of Sherborne the parishes of Buckland Newton, Hermitage, Hilfield, Pulham, and Wootton Glanville with Holnest now in the rural deanery of Cerne within the same archdeaconry and the parishes of Bishop's Caundle, Marsh Caundle, Stourton Caundle, Purse Caundle, Folke, Long Burton, North Wootton, Haydon and Holwell now in the rural deanery of Stalbridge within the archdeaconry of Dorset. "(5) There shall be transferred to the rural deanery of Starminster Newton within the arch-deaconry of IDorset the parishes of Haselbury Bryan, Stoke Wake, Fifehead Neville with Fifehead Saint Quinton, and Mappowder with Plush now in the rural deanery of Cerne within the archdeaconry of Sherborne and the parishes of Lydlinch, Stalbridge within the archdeaconry of Milton within the archdeaconry of Jorset

the parishes of Boberton, Belchalwell and Woolland now in the rural deanery of Milton within the archdeaconry of Dorset. "(6) There shall be transferred to the rural deanery of Shaftesbury within the archdeaconry of Dorset the parishes of Fontmell Magna, Compton Abbas, and Melbury Abbas now in the rural deanery of Sturminster Newton within the

"(7) There shall be transferred to the rural deanery of Blandford within the archdeaconry of Dorset the parish of Durweston now in the rural deanery of Milton within the same archdeaconry and the parish of Iwerne Courtney now in the rural deanery of Sturminster Newton within the same archdeaconry same archdeaconry.

And whereas the provisions of the said Acts, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Nottingham, Holy Trinity with Saint Mark, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house belonging to the benefice of Nottingham, Saint Matthew, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may and be, be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be held and applied by us towards the cost of the provision of a parsonage house for a new district (hereinafter called 'the said proposed new district') proposed to be formed wholly or partly out of the parish of Bestwood Park in the said diocese of Southwell.

"6. Taking down of church. "(a) As soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect, the church of Saint Matthew, Nottingham, shall be taken down and the site thereof together with any ground annexed the site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures. "(b) The materials of the said church of Saint Matthew, Nottingham, shall so far as the Bishop of Southwell may consider it practicable be used in the erection of a church for the said proposed new district and if not so used shall be sold by us.

"(c) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said church of Saint Matthew, Nottingham, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures and as the Bishop of Southwell shall direct be transferred to the church of the said proposed new district or to some other church or churches within the diocese.

"(d) The bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Matthew, Nottingham, or such of them as the Bishop of Southwell shall select, shall be removed to the church of the said proposed new district, and any of such articles not so removed shall, as the said bishop shall direct, be transferred to any other church or chapel within the said diocese or shall be sold by us

"(e) The net proceeds of any sales effected under the authority of this clause of this scheme, after payment of the expenses attendant thereon, and on the taking down of the church, and the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us towards the cost of the provision of a church for the said proposed new district.

"7. Provision for a curate or clerical or lay assistance. Upon the union taking effect a capital
