PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of July, 1954 (N.P. 2607/54), in the words following,

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having being an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such

restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 4th day of November, 1938, sanction was given, inter alia, for special rules governing the rates of pay for Naval Officers of Flag rank (excluding Admirals of the Fleet) during periods when unemployed between appointments.

And whereas we consider that revised rules, such as are already in force for officers of the rank of Captain, R.N. and below, should be instituted to govern the pay of officers of Flag rank while un-

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve that:

"(i) Naval Officers of Flag rank (excluding Admirals of the Fleet), while unemployed between appointments, shall receive the full pay of their rank, together with Marriage Allowance or Lodging

Allowance as appropriate, and Ration Allowance:

"(ii) Officers of the rank of Admiral of the Fleet
whilst unemployed shall nevertheless, and notwithstanding the provisions of Order in Council dated
the 3rd day of June, 1954, continue to receive the
rate of half pay laid down in Schedule I, Section I
to Order in Council dated the 30th day of January,
1952. 1952:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what

is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the Church of Saint Michael in Bedwardine in the parish of Worcester Saint Andrew and All Saints with Saint Helen, in the diocese of Worcester.

commissioners, at such time or times, and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"2. That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales, after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church, shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Worcester established pursuant to the said Measures."
