Genova, May 25. N. S.

Several Barks are arrived here this day from Naples, with about 900 Soldiers on board for the Milanese; as did likewise several Vessels about 5 days ago with Recruits from Thoulon for the French Army in that Dutchy, but they are most of them either too young, or infirm and superannuated, and all forced into the Service.

Warsaw, May 30. The Deputies of the Confederate Nobility continue their Conferences here with the Swedish Commissioners; and it is said, the Alliance between them is as good as concluded, but is not to take place till after the Confederates have chosen a new King, and he has ratified the Treaty. The Cardinal Primate having sent out Circular Letters to the several Palatinates, for their particular Diets to meet, in order to chuse Deputies for a general Diet to proceed to this new Election, those Palatinates which are in the Confederacy have complied with his Summons; but there are such Diffentions among them, that several of these lesser Diets are quite separated, and others adjourned without coming to any Resolution. The King of Poland's Army continues encamped under the Walls of Sendomir, where the general Assembly of the Senators and Chiefs of the Nobility, who continue in his Interest, was opened the 20th Instant. It is said, that 15000 Muscovites, whom the Czar of Muscovy has sent to his Assistance, are arrived in Lithuania; That the Sieur Oginsky, who commands a Body of the Forces of that Dutchy, who defeated a Body of Swedish Troops, killed 320 of them, and taken 30 Prisoners; and that some Parties of the King of Poland's Forces have been very successful on other Occasions.

Hanover, June 10. Monsieur Lintelo, Envoy from the States General of the United Provinces, is lately come to this Place, on his way to the Court of Prussia, where he is to reside. He has deliver'd a Letter of Compliment from the States to our Elector, and another to the Duke of Cell. To morrow he sets out for Wilsenbuzzel, with Letters of the same nature to that Court, and from thence will continue his Journey to Berlin. The Duke of Cell is expected here about a fortnight hence.

Mastricht, June 11. The Army commanded by Monsieur d'Auverquerque encamped the 3d Instant at Viler, near the French Lines; The 4th they marched to Bovelingen, between Borchworm and Borchloen, rested there the 5th; and the next day they advanced to Monikenhoff, beyond Tongeren: This day they decamped from thence in order to march to Hasselt. We hear the Enemy, who since their Retreat into their Lines had remained very quiet, are now advancing towards Dieff, in order to observe the Motions of our Forces.

Kinsale, June 3. Sir Stafford Fairborne, on board the Medway, came in here last night, with several more of Her Majesty's Ships, having parted from Sir Cloudfly Shovel on the 29th past. He has also brought in with him Four Prizes, Two of them Privateers of 10 and 6 Guns, taken by the Assurance and Oxford; the third a French Merchant Man of 120 Tuns, laden

with Salt, and bound for Newfoundland, taken by the Swiftsure and Maidstone; and the other an English Merchant Ship called the Glover Gally, homeward bound from Leghorne, and retaken by the Warspight. He intends to proceed with the first fair Wind for England, with the Fleet which lately arrived here from Turkey under Convoy of Three Men of War.

Falmouth, June 5. The Sidney, a Privateer, Captain Upton Commander, arrived here the 3d Instant from Milford, with two small Ships under his Convoy. Yesterday came in here the Prince Eugene, a Dutch Privateer, who brought in with him a Prize laden with Wine from France. There came in also another Dutch Privateer, who in her Cruise had met with a French Man of War of 60 Guns, and had fought her several hours, and receiv'd some Damage in his Rigging, but got clear of her by the favour of the Night. The Elizabeth of Bermudas, Benjamin Howell Master, is likewise come in from thence, being laden with Sugar, and the Mary of this Place, John Row Master, from Lisbon, with Fruit, both bound for London.

Plymouth, June 6. Her Majesty's Ship the Peuzance failed hence yesterday to the Westward. The same day came in Two Dutch Privateers, with a French Prize laden with Wine and Brandy. This day failed to the Eastward a Dutch Man of War, with 60 Dutch Merchant Men from Portugal; as also several Ships from Ireland, and some Prizes, being all bound for Holland. This day came in here Her Majesty's Advice-Boat the Chatham Prize. The Sidney came in this evening from Falmouth, having under her Convoy Nine Sail of Merchant Men bound for London, Southampton, and other Ports.

Plymouth, June 7. Sir Stafford Fairborne, who set Sail from Kinsale the 5th Instant with the homeward bound Turkey Fleet, is now off this Place, and designs to proceed with them as far as Portsmouth. He left Two Ships of his Squadron off Kinsale, in Chace of Two French Privateers.

Bristol, June 6. The Dragon of this Place George Hart Master, arrived here this day from Zant; but last from Ireland.

Tarmouth, June 9. On the 7th Instant passed thro' our Road Her Majesty's Ship the Rochester Prize, with about 30 Sail under her Convoy from Hull, bound for the River Thames. This day failed out of our Road about 200 light Colliers, bound for Newcastle, under Convoy of the Chester and Nightringale. Her Majesty's Ship the Greyhound came into our Road this afternoon, with several light Colliers under her Convoy from the Southward.

Deale, June 10. Her Majesty's Ship the Solebay failed from the Downes the 8th Instant, to protect our Fishery off the South-Foreland. The same day came into the Downes Her Majesty's Ships the Expedition, Exeter and Coventry, with 118 Sail of homeward bound Merchant Ships under their Convoy from Lisbon, the Streights, and other Parts, but last from Plymouth. Yesterday in the afternoon came in Her Majesty's Ships the Hampshire, Pembroke, Flamborough, and a Fireship, and under their Convoy the Lexington, the Aleppo Fa'or, the Jan. Frigate, the Leghorne Gally, the Mazarine Gally, the Resolution, the Hunter, the Crown, the Josiah, and the Ormond Gally, from Turkey, with

with several other homeward bound Merchant Ships from the *Sreights*, being in all about 30 Sail, which came last from Ireland.

The Dutch Mails of Tuesday and Friday last are not yet come in.
