We hear the Enemy, who fince their Retreat into their Lines

had remained very quiet, are now advancing towards Dief, in order to observe the Motions of our Forces.

Kinfale, June 3. Sir Stafford Fairborne, on board the Midway, came in here last night, with several more of Her Majesty's Ships, having parted from Sir Cloudes Shove I on the 29th past. He has also brought in with him Four Prizes. Two of them Privateers of 10 and 6 Gans, taken by the Assurance and Orfora; the third a treat Manage and Assurance and Orfora; the third a French Merchant Man of 120 Tuns, ladea

with Salt, and bound for Newfoundland, taken by the Swiftfure and Maiastone; and the other an English Merchant Ship called the Glover Gally, homeward bound from Leghorne, and retaken by the Warspight. He intends to proceed with the first fair Wind for England, with the Fleet which lately arrived here from Turky under Convoy of Three Men of War.

Falmouth, Jame 5. The Sidney, a Privateer, Captain Upton Commander, arrived here the 3d Instant from Milford, with two small Ships under his Convoy. Yesterday came in here the Prince Eugene, a Durch Prince Eugen Privateer, who brought in with him a Prize laden with Wine from France. There came in also another Dutch Privateer, who in her Cruize had met with a French Man of War of 60 Guns, and had fought her feveral hours, and receiv'd fome Damage in his Rigging, but got clear of her by the favour of the Night.
