#### " SCHEME.

"1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Colling-tree and the benefice of Courteenhall shall be per-manently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Collingtree with Courteenhall', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct distinct.

"2. Taking effect of union. If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette both of Schene is published in the bondent control of the said benefices shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect; and if upon that day the benefice of Courteenhall only shall be vacant, the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the benefice of Collingtree.

"3. Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Collingtree shall be the house of resi-dence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Courteenhall having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. Diversion of Endowment Income. "(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £650 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Detechorsynch

of Peterborough. (2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £650 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent "(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumpent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators'), upon the calcu-lation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said supplus, we shall have power to require produc-tion by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts tion by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all leval remedies for enforcing production thereof. all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

#### " SCHEDULE.

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,
"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital

"3. Parsonage House. "(a) Upon the union taking effect the parson-age house at present belonging to the benefice of Matlock shall be the house of residence of the in-cumbent of the united benefice.

"(b) Upon the issue, within the period of eighteen months following the taking effect of the union of benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed, of a certificate by the bishop for the time being of the said diocese to the effect that the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Tansley

has been divided into two residences of which one shall remain a glebe house of the united benefice the other of the two residences into which the said parsonage house shall have been divided shall as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and so much of the net proceeds of such sale as we, after consultation with the ceeds of such sale as we, after consultation with the bishop for the time being of the diocese, shall deem necessary shall be applied by us to the cost of the division aforesaid and any balance of the said net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Derby established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(c) Upon the issue by the aforesaid bishop of the hereinbefore mentioned certificate the curate or other clerical or lay assistant or assistants employed by the incumbent of the united benefice in accordance with the provisions of Clause 5 hereof shall reside in the aforesaid glebe house unless the said bishop shall at any time in writing otherwise direct.

"4. Patronage. In every series of three successive turns of presentation to the united benefice after the union has taken effect the patron of the benefice of Matlock shall have the first and third turns and the patron of the benefice of Tansley shall have the second turn.

"5. Clerical and lay assistance. After the union has taken effect the incumbent of the united bene-fice shall, in order to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, employ a curate or such other clerical or lay assistance as the bishop of the diocese shall from time to time direct.
