of sub-paragraph (i) if (a) he is in other respects eligible under these Regulations to compete; and (b) he is recommended to the Civil Service Commissioners by the appropriate Service Authority, as warranting consideration for appointment to the Special Departmental Classes by reason of his record, education, intelligence, and personal qualities.

## METHODS I AND II.

5. Age.

Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held. But a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st August of the year in which the examination is held.

6. Sex.

Both men and women are eligible, except that posts of Probationary Assistant Postal Controller are open to men only.

7. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must

either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject, or
(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions

and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her 'Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry appringing or resi-

dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

8. Health and Character.
Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

The number of vacancies to be filled from the competition as a whole, and the number to be filled by Method I and Method II respectively, will be determined by the Commissioners.

10. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

Assignment.

Candidates will be considered for all the posts for which they are eligible under these Regulations; they will, however, be asked to state on their application forms their preferences among the four Departments. The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. Assigneach successful candidate is to be assigned. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service and the candidates' suitability for particular Departments, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account. Candidates' suitability for Departments will be assessed by the Interview Board.

The names of the successful candidates will be issued in four lists according to the Departments to which they are assigned; a candidate who declines to accept the post for which he is declared successful will have no claim to be assigned to another.

A candidate cannot be considered for appointment as J.I.B. Officer, Grade III, in the Ministry of Defence unless

(a) as a Method I candidate he includes in his (a) as a Method II candidate he includes in his optional subjects one or more of the following: (30) General Economics, (31) Industry and Trade, (34) Social Economics, (35, 36) Economic History, (37) Economic Statistics, (51, 52) Geology, (55) Physical Geography, (56) Human Geography, (57) Geography of the British Isles, (93) Russian Language, (94, 95) Russian Civilisation; or (b) as a Method II candidate his degree course has included the study of one or more of the

has included the study of one or more of the

above as a main subject.

12. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

The total fee payable by all candidates is £2 for either Method separately, and £3 for both Methods. Of this £1 must be paid on application.
