The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 9 of the Finance Act, 1932, section 7 of the Finance Act, 1934 and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz. :—

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 7) Order, 1954, which amends the present scheme for the allowance of drawback of Customs duty paid on

- (a) imported square-sawn wood and timber
- (b) imported veneers

used in the manufacture of certain sewing machine woodwork which is exported or shipped as stores.

To meet altered conditions, the rate of drawback for veneers so used is increased from 7s. 6d. to 9s. 9d. per cubic foot, and amendments are made to the quantities of imported materials to be taken into account in calculating the drawback payable on the articles exported.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st October, 1954, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1954 No. 1248.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

APPLICATION FOR THE MARKING OF IMPORTED OIL BURNING APPARATUS.

In accordance with the provisions of sub-section 4 of Section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade hereby announce that, in pursuance of an application received by them for the

making of an Order-in-Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by the Board of Trade under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

Paraffin pressure and non-pressure operated heating, boiling, cooking and lighting appliances together with independent burner units for use therein, and petrol and paraffin operated brazing and blow lamps.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they have discretion also to consider and report whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

Civil Service Commission, 28th September, 1954.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF INSTRUCTORS (INSTRUCTIONAL OFFICERS GRADES III AND IV) AND OCCUPATIONAL SUPERVISORS (INSTRUCTIONAL OFFICERS GRADE III) UNDER THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE.

1. There are no age limits. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service and weight may be given to this factor in considering candidates who are over 50 years of age.

2. Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible for appointment to the established staff unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at the time of death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Candidates must be (a) experienced and fully-skilled in their particular trade, craft or subject, (b) able to teach their trade, craft or subject, and (c) able to supervise the work, and maintain control, of trainees engaged in their trade, craft or subject.

Candidates should have undergone the training usual in their particular trade, craft or subject, followed by practical experience on fully-skilled work for a reasonable number of years (normally not less than five years in a craft trade). These provisions may be waived only exceptionally for individual candidates whose training in the trade, craft or subject and practical experience are comparable to the qualifications normally required. It is desirable for candidates for posts in Grade III to be in possession of an Ordinary National Certificate or City and Guilds Certificate or equivalent qualifications in the appropriate subject where such qualifications exist.

5. Those candidates who appear from their applications to have the best qualifications and experience may be required to take a trade test and will be summoned to interview before a Selection Board which will recommend for the vacancy existing the candidate who seems to be most suitable.

6. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment.

7. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed in an unestablished capacity subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character and to the payment of a fee of 5s.

8. After a minimum qualifying period of two years' unestablished service in the grade Instructors and Occupational Supervisors appointed under these regulations may be considered for appointment to the established staff as and when vacancies occur thereon, if they are recommended by their Department as qualified in other respects. Those so considered will appear before a final Selection Board set up by the Civil Service Commissioners, which will recommend to the Commissioners the candidates who appear to be qualified.

9. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on the issue by the Civil Service Commissioners of a certificate of qualification; a fee of 15s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £1, is payable before the certificate of qualification can be issued.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF BOYS AND GIRLS TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. *Age.*

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on 1st March, 1955. But candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a Certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service before 1st March, 1955.

2. *Sex.*

Both boys and girls are eligible.

3. *Nationality.*

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. *Health and Character.*

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Candidates may take three optional subjects. Not more than two languages may be chosen from the list given under head (5).

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit on their total marks in the examination. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not reach a standard which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

6 Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

7. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF BOYS AND GIRLS TO GRADE 6 POSTS IN BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on 1st March, 1955. BUT candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service before 1st March, 1955.

2. Sex and Marriage.

Candidates may be of either sex; but

(a) married women are not eligible (a woman member of Branch B must resign her appointment on marriage);

(b) the approval of the Secretary of State is required before a successful male candidate who is married takes up appointment.

3. Nationality.

(1) Every candidate must

(a) be a natural-born British subject; and

(b) have been born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions of parents both of whom were also born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions.

(2) No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

4. Health and Character.
