Dublin September 18.

This day arrived here his Excellency the Lord Roberts Lord Lieutenant of His Majesties Kingdoms of Ireland, whose reception was intended to have been made with much State and solemnity, but His Excellency waving these publick honors met the Lord Deputy and the Council in the Council chamber this Evening, where after he had taken the usual Oath; The Lord Deputy delivered him the Sword; between whom passed many civilities.

Pendennis, Sept. 20. Here are now in Port about 30 sail of ships.

On Friday last sailed hence the ship from *New York* intending with her lading of Tobacco, Hides and Furrs for *Amsterdam*. Here lately came in the *St. Jacob* of *London* from *Amsterdam* bound for *Virginia*, with several small ships from *London* and other parts bound for *Burdeaux* and other parts of *France*, and some few ships are also arrived laden with Salt.

Yesterday came in the *Recovered Lyon* from *Rotterdam* bound for *Burdeaux*, and with her the *Crown* of *Rotterdam* intending for *Rochelle*, they came out in company with divers others which they suppose may have fallen in about *Plymouth*.

Plymouth, Sept. 21. Here is lately arrived a ship of this place from the *Caribbe Islands*, another from *Portugal*, and about 6 Traders from *Wales*.

Rome, Sept. 7. The Pope having spent a considerable time in Devotion, and encouraged by his example the Plenty of others by their Prayers to implore the Divine assistance for the defence of the City of *Gandia*, has some inclinations to open the Treasury in the Castle of *St. Angelo*, and to employ in this important service some part of those Moneys which were by a Bull of *Sexsus Quintus* reserved to serve the Ecclesiastique Estate in time of eminent danger and greatest necessity. He has in the mean while given Order for the resigning of men within the Ecclesiastical Estate, and has prevailed with several persons of greatest Quality and Wealth to offer their voluntary Contribution towards the relief of the place, and particularly, Father *Stiva* the Popes Confessor and General of the Order of *Jesuits* has contributed an 400 thousand Crowns in the name of the whole Society & Cardinal *Chigi* the sum of 30 thousand, whose examples tis believed will be generously followed by the rest of the Cardinals.

This week the Pope had a long conference with the Emperours and the Venetian Ambassadour about the affairs relating to *Gandia*, since which an Express was dispatcht away by the latter to the Senate.

The Pope in Gratitude for the succor sent by His most Christian Majesty to the assistance of the Venetians, has given Order for erecting that Kings Statue in the place of *Traiano di monti*.

From *Naples* we are advised that the Viceroy *Dun Pedro d' Aragon* having received the Resignation of the Generalship of the Gallies from *Don Giannettino Doria*, who by reason of his age was willing to retire from publick employment and to retire to *Barcellona*; immediately dispatcht away his Letters to *Messina*, to recal the Duke *di Ferrandina* to take possession of that vacant Command.

Vienna, Sept. 14. Their Imperial Majesties went the 5th instant for *Ebersdorf* where they intended to continue the greatest part of the Autumn, but the Emperour fre-

quently visits this place where he holds Councils about the affairs of the Empire.

The Turkish Aga who came to demand the demolishing of the Fort near *Gomorra*, is returned with answer to this effect. That Commissioners should be nominated to meet such others as shall be appointed by the Visier of *Buda*; to examine whether the said Fort be built upon the dependencies of the Emperour or not, and a Courier was dispatcht to *Larissa* with full power to the Baron *de Casa Nova* to Treat thereupon; as also about the Regulation of the bounds; since this General *Montecuculi* is gone for *Raab* with Order to take care of the Fortifications of all our frontier Towns, and the supply of the Garrisons with all necessaries and conveniences, that so they might not be surprised if the Turk should bend his force upon them.

A Courier has been lately dispatcht from the Emperour into *Spain* with Letters to the Queen Regent, soliciting that the Prince of *Lorain* might be employed in the Government of the *Netherlands*, offering to be his Caution; if the Prince succeeds in this affair, tis believed he may enter into a nearer Alliance with the Emperour.

The Emperour is not a little dissatisfied with the Popes refusal of the Cardinal *de Hesse's* desires in his name for the promotion of a Cardinal at his the Emperours nomination, as was before granted to the two Crowns of *France* and *Spain*, in resentment whereof tis believed the Nuncio will be obliged to leave this place, and to retire out of the Emperours Dominions, but tis hoped the Pope may be yet prevailed with to give the Emperour this satisfaction.

We have late advice from *Hungary*, that the Evangelists or Protestants are yet dissatisfied, and that they had in some numbers attempted to repossess themselves of their Churches.

Genova September 18. *Hippolito Centurione* is lately arrived here with Monsieur *de St Arpe*, but with intention to remove both himself and his Family to *Thoulon*; having espoused the French Interest, and entered himself into their service; yet his squadron of Gallies are to have for some time their Rendezvous here or at *Vado*, where a Castle is now building, though they meet with difficulties in laying part of its foundation in the Sea.

Cardinal *Antonio Barberini* having fallen ill at *Savona*; is said to be somewhat recovered from his indisposition, and may in few days be able to pursue his intended voyage for the Court of *Rome*.

At *Milan* the Marquis *de los Valbafes* the Governor, with the persons of greatest Eminency, have been solemnly engaged in solemnizing the entry of the lately Canoniz'd Saints *Peter d' Alcantara*, into the number of Saints; since which the Cardinal *Litta* the Archbishop was pleased to enjoin other devotions, with prayers for the good estate of *Gandia*, in all the Principal Churches; and for the assistance of the Republick of *Venice* in the defence of that place; the Duke of *Mantous* has caused several companies to march for *Venice*, which he intends to maintain upon his own expences during the continuance of the siege. On the 12 instant the Governor of *Milan* had ordered a general review to be taken of all the forces under his command, amongst whom he intended to make a considerable reformation.

Hague, Sept. 26. The Dutches of *East Frisland* having not hitherto been able to compose the differences between that Province and the Bishop of *Munster*; has lately sent hither the Sieur *de Wiarda* in Quality of her Envoy Extraordinary, to give the States an account of all Transac-
