**NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949.**

*Gloucester Rural District Council (Drews Court, Churchdown) Diversion Order, 1954.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 8th day of October, 1954, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the under-mentioned public rights of way over land owned by Harold John Limbrick at Drews Court, Churchdown:—

**Existing Footpath No. 1.**

A footpath of undefined width running over O.S. 376 and 379 from a point near a property known as The Pines for a distance of 470 feet from east to west to a point where it joins the highway near the Wesleyan Methodist Church, marked A-D-B and coloured brown as indicated in map.

**Proposed New Footpath No. 1.**

Approximately parallel with the existing footpath described above commencing and finishing at the aforesaid terminal points but having a length of 480 feet, marked A-E-B and coloured purple as indicated in map.

**Existing Footpath No. 2.**

A footpath of undefined width running over O.S. 376 and 378 from a point near a property known as The Pines for a distance of 850 feet from north to south to a point where it joins the highway near a property known as Hillside, marked A-F-C and coloured brown as indicated in map.

**Proposed New Footpath No. 2.**

Commencing at a point near a property known as The Pines and running in a south-easterly direction for 150 feet, thence south-westerly for 240 feet, thence south-easterly for 500 feet and thence to the south for 150 feet to its termination at the highway near a property known as Hillside, a total length of 1,040 feet, marked A-H-G-C and coloured purple as indicated in map.

Both the proposed new footpaths will have a width of six feet.

Stiles are to be erected at the points indicated on the said map.

The old right of way will be closed as from the 6th day of November, 1954.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Council, Berkeley Chambers, Gloucester, and will be open for inspection free of charge during the usual office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 15th day of October, 1954, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
