The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of October, 1954, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Botolph, Aldgate and Holy Trinity, Minorities; Christ Church with All Saints, Spitalfields; and Saint Paul with Saint Mark, Whitechapel; all in the diocese of London.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Botolph, Aldgate, and Holy Trinity, Minorities; Christ Church with All Saints, Spitalfields; and Saint Paul with Saint Mark, Whitechapel; shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Christ Church with All Saints, Spitalfields, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Botolph, Aldgate, and Holy Trinity, Minorities (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto), which was formerly part of the parish of Christ Church with All Saints, Spitalfields and was annexed to the said parish of Saint Botolph, Aldgate, and Holy Trinity, Minorities, by virtue of paragraph 19 of Part II of a Scheme prepared by us, the said Church Commissioners, pursuant to the Reorganisation Areas Measure, 1944, and the City of London (Guild Churches) Act, 1952, and confirmed by an Order under our common seal dated the 29th day of January, 1954, notice whereof was published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of February, 1954.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Paul with Saint Mark, Whitechapel, being:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Saint Botolph, Aldgate, and Holy Trinity, Minorities (coloured green on the map annexed hereto), which was formerly part of the parish of Saint Paul with Saint Mark, Whitechapel, and was annexed to the said parish of Saint Botolph, Aldgate, and Holy Trinity, Minorities, by virtue of paragraph 19 of Part II of the Scheme which is specified in paragraph 1 of this Schedule.

"(b) All that detached part of the parish of Saint Botolph, Aldgate, and Holy Trinity, Minorities (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto), which comprises the site of the Royal Mint and the site of the former Saint Botolph's, Aldgate, Charity Schools and is bounded on all sides by the parish of Saint Paul with Saint Mark, Whitechapel."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Barbon and the benefice of Middleton both situate in the diocese of Carlisle.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Barbon and the benefice of Middleton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Barbon and Middleton', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend James Harrison if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Barbon shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice."

And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.
