"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts mentioned therein, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Raithby with Hallington in the County and diocese of Lincoln.

"Scheme.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Lady Frances Sidney Sussex in the University of Cambridge (hereinafter called 'The Master, Fellows and Scholars') are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Wimborne Minster, Saint Michael, Colehill and Witchampton, all of which parishes are situated in the diocese of Salisbury.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Wimborne Minster, Saint Michael, Colehill and Witchampton shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.
