Whereas it hath been represented unto his Royal Highness, Lord High Admiral of England, That several Ships of Her Majesty's Subjects, fitted out as Privateers, and others with Letters of Marque, do put in at the Port of Argiers; and that for want of Passes, according to the Treaty between Her Majesty and their Government, they may run great hazard of being seized, and confiscated: His Royal Highness does therefore give Notice, That when any Ship doth hereafter sake our Commissioners for Privateers or Letters of Marque, it is absolutely necessary that they, as well as all other Merchant Ships or Vessels, which may come into the said Port of Argier, do furnish themselves at the Office with the usual Passes, to prevent any Prejudice, that otherwise may happen to them.

Whereas his Royal Highness, from his Princely Regard to the Safety of Navigation, was pleased to direct the Master, Wardens, and Assistants of Trinity-Harbour to cause some proper Sea-Mark to be placed upon Asy Dawn in the Isle of Wight, in the room of a Mile which lately stood there, and served as a Direction for Ships in their Passage into St. Helens; to avoid running on De-mau's Land: Notice is hereby given, That a Building, about the height of this Mile, is accordingly erected upon the very Spot, and that by keeping the same open with the tops of the Trees between it and the Shore, Ships will be carried clear of the said Stake of De-mau's Land.
