

(15) a footpath from Weare Street, Ockley, south-westwards around the South side of "Weavers"

(16) a footpath from the Tilburstow Hill Road, Godstone, westwards through the Brickworks and South of the railway to R/W 293 East of Seven Acre Wood

(17) a footpath from R/W 298 North of "Kentwyns", South Nutfield, westwards for a distance of approximately 200 yards to the stile at the field boundary

(18) a footpath from the Nutfield/Horley Parish boundary at Port Barn northwards across Redhill Aerodrome to King's Mill Lane, Nutfield

(19) a bridleway from R/W 112 at Royal Common, Peper Harow, southwards to R/W 110

(20) a bridleway from the junction of Rs/W 110A and 112 at Royal Common, Peper Harow, south-eastwards to R/W 121A

(21) a bridleway from R/W 113 at the Peper Harow Parish boundary south-eastwards to R/W 121 at Bagmoor Cottage, Witley

(22) a bridleway from R/W 110A at Royal Common, Peper Harow, north-eastwards and then south-eastwards to R/W 121 at Bagmoor Common, Witley

and by the addition thereto of the following public paths or other ways, being

(23) a footpath from the North end of R/W 1A north-eastwards along the River Thames towpath (alongside Ferry Road) to Hampton Ferry, Hurst Park

(24) a footpath from R/W 400 south-west of The Plantation near Salfords northwards to Mason's Bridge Road

(25) a bridleway from the County boundary at Bury St. Austen's Lodge northwards to Furzen Lane at the Abinger/Ewhurst Parish boundary

(26) a footpath from R/W 352 at Rowley Farm, Tinsley Green, south-eastwards to the County boundary

(27) a footpath from Road A.23 near Long Bridge, Horley, northwards past the West door of St. Bartholomew's Church to R/W 362 at The Six Bells P.H.

(28) a footpath from R/W 433 at the Leigh/Newdigate Parish boundary northwards past Brook Farm and Rye Barn to Clayhill Road at Kiln Copse

(29) a footpath from Weare Street, Ockley, north-east of "Weavers" south-westwards along the northern boundary of "Weavers"

(30) a footpath from R/W 298 at the garden gate of "Kentwyns", South Nutfield, north-westwards for a distance of approximately 200 yards to the stile at the field boundary

(31) a footpath from R/W 112 at Royal Common, Peper Harow, southwards to R/W 110

(32) a footpath from the junction of Rs/W 110A and 112 at Royal Common, Peper Harow, south-eastwards to R/W 121A

(33) a footpath from R/W 113 at the Peper Harow Parish boundary south-eastwards to R/W 121 at Bagmoor Cottage, Witley

(34) a footpath from R/W 110A at Royal Common, Peper Harow, north-eastwards and then south-eastwards to R/W 121 at Bagmoor Common, Witley.

KIVETON PARK RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

The Kiveton Park Rural District Council Axle Lane, South Anston Diversion Order, 1954.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 5th day of January, 1955, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert as from the 16th day of February, 1955, Axle Lane, South Anston from its junction with the Sheffield to Worksop main road (route A.57) to its junction approximately 486 yards in a south-easterly direction with the footpaths from Todwick and Kiveton Park, to a line running from a point on the south side of the Sheffield to Worksop main road (route A.57) approximately 271 yards east of the junction of this road and Axle Lane, and proceeding in a southerly direction for approximately 300 yards to the boundary of Field No. 190 and thence in an easterly direction for approximately 20 yards to the junction already referred to of Axle Lane and the footpaths from Todwick and Kiveton Park.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Kiveton Park, near Sheffield, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (Saturdays 9 a.m. to 12 noon).

The Order becomes operative as from the 14th day of January, 1955, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
