The Emperor's Refident accompanied this Letter with a short Speech, to acquaint Her Majesty, That he had express Orders from his Master earnestly to press with all Respect, That Her Majesty would be pleased to require his Grace co make no further Scruple herein. Count Wratishw had indeed told his Grace, That the Emperor defired he would accept of the Honour intended him of the Title and Dignity of a Prince of the Empire; whereupon his Grace prayed the Count to repre-fent to the Emperor, That he was extreamly fensible of his Imperial Majesty's Goodness towards him, beyond any thing he could deserve, but that his Ambition was envirely bounded in the Queen's Grace and Favour, whose abundant Kindness had been already extended towards him beyond whatever he could have aimed at, and that he must refer himself wholly to Her Majesty's good Pleasure.

The Duke of Mariborough also received from the Emperor a Letter of Thanks, dated at Vienna the 12th of this Mouth, N. S. on Occasion of this Victory, wherein his Imperial Majesty is pleased. fed to do the English the Honour to attribute in an especial Manner the Success of that day to his Grace's Con lust, and the Valour of Her Majefly's Troops; not doubting but his Grace, in Conjunction with Prince Lewis of Baden, and the other Imperial Generals, will use their utmost Endeavours to finish as Gloriopsily as they have begun, and put an end to the War which the Elector of Bavaria has raised in the Heart of Germany; concluding with the Honour the English have attained, unknown to former Ages, of carrying their Victorious Arms into Upper Ger-
