## Tangier August 23.

N the roth inftant arrived here the Mary Rofe and with her his Excellency the Lord Henry Homard, who Landed the next day, and was Hohourably Received and Treated by the Deputy Governour according to his Quality and Character, where his Excellency intends to continue till the Emperour of Morocco having notice of his arrival thall fecure his farther voyage by such Hoftages and Guards as shall be thought convenient for the fecurity of so confuse-

rable a perfon. We have here feveral Reports, of that Emperours later Actions, fome reporting that he has been engaged with his Army South vards to vards Santa Cruz, where he has net with opposition and fome ill fuccels from a Nephew or Kinfman of his, who is in the Field with an Army of about 60000 men.

Others with greater probability of truth inform us, that the Enemy he had to deal with, were fome Rebellious Mountainers; whom he has wholly conquered, and for a terrout to others put fleveral thousands of them to the floword, felling their Wives and Children for flaves in the publick Markets.

Romo, Septi'14. This Week arrived a Courtier from Spain, with Letters to the Count d'Aftorga the Spaniff-Ambaffidor, who, in Obedience to this Queens Commands apply'd himfelf to Father Mithard, late Confession to the Queen Regent, prefing him to refign into the hands of the Pope the Inquisitorship of Spain, which (as it feems) is defined to be conferr'd on Monlegnior Vagliadores, Bishop of Placenta, and President of Gassille; but, Father Nithard having twice testuled to comply with the Queens defires in this Affair of to neer concernment to himself, his Process is framing, and 'tis believed the New Inquisitor will suddenly be confirmed in the Election.

About 3 fayes fince arrived a Polach at Civita Vecchia, in 12 dayet from Can lia, with Letters from Don Vincenzo' Rofpiglioff, of the 28th of Auguft, giving the Pope's true, but Private Account of the State and Condition of that Place. The Pai on difpatch by him with the faid Letters informes us, That the French Ships and Galleys, with the Popes found ron, inten led to leave that place the 2 dof Schember 9 and that the Fown being unable any longer to defend if felf, was shout to Treatupon Termes of Surrender, but, of this (chough ill) Rep.re we.expect a 'fard' ther Confirmation.

From Aleppo we are adviled that the Plague has reged

during this laft Summer with extraordinary violence, having deftroyed above x;o thouland pe lons, which is above one half of the inhabitants of the City, but began to abate proportionably with the heat of the weather.

This morning put in here the Algier Merchani with Oyls from Puglia bound for London, intending to depart in company with the Golden Fleece and the two before mentioned Dutch thips from Scanderoon.

This halt week the Conde de Prado the Portugal Amballadordefigned for Rome had two confiderable Prefents made him ef all forts of Provisions, which us bel eved may be convinued to him during his abade here, which may be about a Moneth, and a large Coach with 6 Hotles is first to him from Florence to ferve him till his departure.
