WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of February, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Chatton and the benefice of Chillingham, both situate in the diocese of Newcastle. in the diocese of Newcastle.

- "1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Chatton and the benefice of Chillingham shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Chatton with Chillingham', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Stanley Gill, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Chatton, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice the united benefice.
- "3. Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Chatton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Chillingham, together with the site and appurtenances thereof, and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be appropriated and held by us for the augmentation of the endowment of the united benefice.
- "4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Chatton having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.
- "5. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery. The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Lindisfarne and in the rural deanery of Bamburgh."

 And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral

Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the pre-paration and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of February, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Coventry (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) for effecting (1) the union of Haselor (now part of the benefice of Haselor with Billesley) with the benefice of Kinwarton with Great Alne, and (2) the union of Billesley (being the remaining part of the benefice of Saint Andrew, Wilmcote, all of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Coventry.

SCHEME.

"Whereas by virtue of an Order (hereinafter called 'the Order of 1938') of His late Majesty King George the Sixth in Council published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of November, 1938, the parish of Haselor and the parish of Billesley, together constituting the area of the benefice of Haselor with Billesley, were united together and now form one parish for ecclesiastical purposes:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Union of the benefices of Kinwarton with Great Alne and Haselor.

Alne and Haselor.

"(1) Union of benefices.

"(i) The benefice of Kinwarton with Great Alne and a part, namely Haselor, of the benefice of Haselor with Billesley, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Kinwarton with Great Alne and Haselor'.

"(ii) The limits of the parish to belong or be assigned to the aforesaid part of the benefice of Haselor with Billesley shall be conterminous with the area which constituted the parish of Haselor
