MORLEY WATER.

Change of Route of Main.

NOTICE is hereby given that a change is proposed to be made in the route of the water main referred to in the Order for which the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Morley have applied to the Minister of Housing and Local Government, notice of which was published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of September, 1954.

The change relates to the route of that part of the proposed Work No. 1 (a water main or water mains) which will be laid in the borough of Brighouse between Wakefield Road and Booth Royd Lane, and in the urban district of Spenborough between Gomershall Cricket Ground and Nibshaw Lane, the proposal being that the work will be along a different route between these points from that shown on the map referred to in the said notice and deposited as therein mentioned.

Copies of the draft Order and maps showing the situation of the said work where the change is proposed to be made have been deposited at the offices of the undersigned Town Clerk at his Office, Town Hall, Morley, and at the office of the Town Clerk of Brighouse, and may be inspected free of charge by any person at all reasonable hours during a period of twenty-eight days from the date of this notice.

A notice relating to the proposed change has been or will be published in the Yorkshire Post and Leeds Mercury on the 28th day of February, 1955, and the 7th day of March, 1955.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:—Cattle plague or rinder-pest (*pestis-bovina*), 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*), 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*), 1850; rabies, 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*), 1906; glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*), 1928 and parasitic mange (*psoroptes et sarcoptes scabiei equi*), 1948. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.
