Ratisbon, August 18. General Herbeville came about 10 days ago before Beyershoff; and summoned the Governor to surrender; who refusing to do it, the General began to batter that Place the 11th Instant, at 5 in the morning; About 8 he made a general Assault, and by 10 was Master of the Place: Part of the Garison was put to the Sword; but after the first Fury of our Soldiers was over, they gave Quarter to the Governor and the rest of his Men, who remain Prisoners of War. The next day General Herbeville fent a Detachment to Donaustauff, another Town belonging to the Elector of Bavaria, which immediately furrendered. The 19th he came hither, and took possesfion of our Gate, and Bridge over the Danuke, and of our two Gates towards the Country; the Bavarian Forces which had lain here several months, in order to keep the Imperial Diet in awe, being retired fome days before, upon the Arrival in these Parts of the Cosederate Forces under the Command of his Grace the Duke of The same day Te Deum was Marlbortugh. fung here for the late Glorious Victory over the French and Bavarian Armies near Bieinbeim, and for our Deliverance from their Power. The General intends to leave a Regiment of the Forces of Helle and another of hose of Prussia in Garisen here, and to march to morrow with the rest of his Troops to attack Straubingen. Falmoistli
