"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Yetminster with Chetnole and Leigh and (2) altering the names of these parishes, both of which parishes are in the diocese of Salisbury.
