REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ARCHITEC-TURAL AND ENGINEERING DRAUGHTSMEN.

Candidates must be at least 20 on 1st June, 1955. There is no upper age limit, but in appointing persons in a permanent capacity Departments expect regular and effective service for a reasonable period,

and the Commissioners will take this requirement into account.

2. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years. than seven years.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour. Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Admiralty, War Office, Air Ministry, Ministry of Supply, Ministry of Defence, or Government Communications Headquarters (Foreign Office), unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to competition or appointment by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, Secretary of State for War, Secretary of State for Air, Minister of Supply, Minister of Defence or Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs as the case may be. for Foreign Affairs as the case may be.
