"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Thomas Sinclair if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary Magdalene, Gilsland, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Nether Denton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of June, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and the Acts therein mentioned have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the interest hereinafter mentioned in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Stilton with Denton and Caldecote in the County of Huntingdon and in the diocese of Ely.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that the patronage of the said benefice is exercised in a series of three successive turns of presentation of which the Reverend Joseph William Churchill of 15, Westminster Road, Branksome Park, Bournemouth, is entitled to one turn.

"And whereas the said Joseph William Churchill desires to transfer his interest in the advowson of the said benefice to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same).

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable David Patrick Maxwell, Viscount Kilmuir, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty and with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely, as bishop of the diocese in which the said benefice is situate (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the Law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said interest of the said Joseph William Churchill in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Lord High Chancellor on behalf of Your Majesty for ever."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in

law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ely.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of May, 1954:

And whereas the Parochial Church Council of St. Mary's Church, South Darley, appealed against the said Scheme and such Appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order of Her Majesty in Council of the 15th day of July, 1954:

And whereas in pursuance of an Order of Her Majesty in Council of the 7th day of April, 1955, approving the Report made by the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council in the matter of the said Appeal, the said Scheme has been revised by the said Church Commissioners:

And whereas the said Scheme so revised is in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Derby (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Darley and the benefice of South Darley both situate in the diocese of Derby.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Darley and the benefice of South Darley shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Darley with South Darley', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Ronald John Stanford if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Darley shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Darley shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of South Darley, shall form part of the endowments of the united benefice but shall be used for the purpose of a house of residence for the curate referred to in Clause 4 of this Scheme unless the Bishop of Derby for the time being shall at any time by writing otherwise direct.

"4. *Curate.* Upon the union taking effect the incumbent shall employ a curate to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice.

"5. *Diversion of Endowment Income.*

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £580 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Derby to be applied as far as the Bishop of Derby, with the concurrence of the Derby diocesan board of finance may deem necessary, towards payment of the curate referred to in Clause 4 of this Scheme.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £580 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in
