

## Amended Notice.

## BOROUGH OF WOOD GREEN.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.

*Commerce Road Redevelopment Area.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Wood Green as agents for the Middlesex County Council the Local Planning Authority, in pursuance of Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950, on the 5th day of November, 1954, gave a Direction, which was approved by the Minister of Housing and Local Government on the 14th day of June, 1955, subject to certain modifications. The Direction as so modified will come into force on the 15th day of July, 1955.

The Direction as modified prohibits any development (other than the carrying out of any works the cost of which does not exceed £100 in any period of twelve months) of the descriptions set out in the Schedule hereto in the areas of land with frontages on Trinity Road, Finsbury Road, Commerce Road, the west side of the High Road and the south side of Nightingale Road situate in the borough of Wood Green and shown coloured blue and hatched green on the map annexed to the Direction, unless permission is granted on an application in that behalf.

A copy of the Direction and of the map defining the areas to which it relates may be seen during the usual office hours at the Town Hall, Wood Green, N.22.

## SCHEDULE.

Development of any of the descriptions specified in Class I (1) of the First Schedule to the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950, which relates to development within the curtilage of a dwellinghouse.

Development of any of the descriptions (except the provision, re-arrangement or replacement of private ways or private railways, sidings or conveyors) specified in Class VIII (1) of the First Schedule to the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950, which relates to development for industrial purposes.

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF WEST KESTEVEN.

*West Kesteven Rural District Council (Little Ponton and Stroxtan Footpath) Diversion Order, 1955.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 14th day of June, 1955, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from the Little Ponton/Stroxtan Road at a point 350 yards from the Eastern Boundary of O.S. plot No. 7 in a Northerly direction to the South West Corner of O.S. Plot No. 3, thence in a north easterly direction across O.S. plot No. 3, to a point on the Eastern Boundary of O.S. plot No. 3, at a position 107 yards south of the North East corner of O.S. plot No. 3, thence in a Northerly direction across O.S. plots Nos. 110 and 109 to a point on the North West Boundary of O.S. plot No. 109 at a position 40 yards West from the North East corner of O.S. plot No. 109 to a line running from the Little Ponton/Stroxtan Road at the South East Boundary of O.S. plot No. 7 in a North Westerly direction along the North East Boundary of O.S. plot No. 7 and O.S. plot No. 3 to a point at a position 107 yards South of the North East corner of O.S. plot No. 3 thence in a North westerly direction along the South West Boundaries of O.S. plots Nos. 110 and 109 to a point at the North West corner of O.S. plot No. 109 thence in a North Easterly direction along the North West Boundary of O.S. plot No. 109 to a point on the North West Boundary of O.S. plot No. 109 at a position 40 yards West from the North East corner of O.S. plot No. 109. The existing public right of way will be closed on the 19th day of July, 1955.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, 19, Watergate, Grantham, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

The Order becomes operative as from the 15th day of July, 1955, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

*Godstone Rural District Council (Footpath No. 101 Oxted) Diversion Order, 1955.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 1st day of July, 1955, and is about to be submitted to the Ministry of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Oxted in the Rural District of Godstone in the County of Surrey.

The effect of the Order will be to divert that part of the public right of way (footpath No. 101) running from Oxted Mill to Tanhouse Road which passes over the drive to the Mill House to a line immediately adjoining and to the west of the existing path for a distance of approximately 200 feet.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Council Offices, Oxted, Surrey, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any weekday except Saturday and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

*Godstone Rural District Council (Footpath No. 68 Limpsfield) Diversion Order, 1955.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 1st day of July, 1955, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Limpsfield in the Rural District of Godstone in the County of Surrey.

The effect of the Order will be to divert part of the public right of way (Footpath No. 68) running from Red Lane, Limpsfield, opposite Old Cottage in an easterly direction to Itchinwood Common to a line from a point on Red Lane approximately 70 feet south of the existing line running in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 280 feet and then turning north east for a distance of approximately 60 feet to meet the existing line of the path at the foot of the railway embankment.
