PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 1st day of July, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Mary, Lancaster; and Saint Anne, Lancaster, both in the diocese of Blackburn.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the Right Reverend Walter, Bishop of Blackburn, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

“Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Mary, Lancaster; and Saint Anne, Lancaster, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

“THE SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Anne, Lancaster being:—

“All that part of the parish of Saint Mary, Lancaster, (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded partly on the east by the parish of Quernmore, on the south by the parishes of Christ Church, Lancaster; Saint Anne, Lancaster; and Saint John, Lancaster, partly on the west by the said parish of Saint John, Lancaster, and on the remaining sides by imaginary lines as follows:—

“(A) Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the said parish of Saint John, Lancaster, in the middle of Caton Road, thence in a northeasterly then easterly direction along the middle of the last-mentioned road and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of Grimeshaw Lane, thence first in a northwesterly then in a northeasterly direction along the middle of the last-mentioned lane to the western boundary of the said parish of Quernmore.

“(B) Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the parish of Quernmore, at the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 1027, thence in an easterly direction along the last-named wall or fence to its end and in a straight

line in continuation thereof to the middle of the unnamed footpath leading from Moor Side to Moor Lane and thence westwards along the middle of the said unnamed footpath to the junction of Grimeshaw Lane, Moor Lane, and Ridge Lane, and in a southeasterly direction to and along the middle of the last-named lane to a point opposite the northern end of the unnamed footpath leading to Nightingale Hall, thence in a southerly direction to and along the middle of the last-named footpath and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the point where it joins the northern boundary of the said parish of Christ Church, Lancaster.”

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Blackburn.

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Upwood with Great Raveley and the benefice of Little Raveley both situate in the diocese of Ely.

“SCHEME.

“1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Upwood with Great Raveley and the benefice of Little Raveley shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Upwood with Great and Little
