

Uxbridge Urban District.

Add footpath from Urban District boundary on Kingsend Golf Course south-westwards along bank of canal feeder and under railway bridge to The Greenway.

Wembley Borough.

Delete footpaths numbered 47 and 62.

Add footpath from access gate to Silver Jubilee Park on Borough boundary northwards along boundary fence of Park to west side of Fryent Grove then south-westwards to Park entrance between Nos. 106 and 108 Townsend Lane.

Clowne Rural District Council (Whitwell Colliery Footpath) Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 2nd day of August, 1955, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert as from the 1st day of September, 1955, the public right of way running from the entrance of Whitwell Station, across the railway, alongside the Colliery Tip, through the tunnel under the Colliery Tip to a point opposite the Station Cottages off Millash Lane to a line running from the entrance of Whitwell Station to Southfield Lane, Whitwell.

The Beckenham (Kent House Lane and Bell Green Lane to Kangley Bridge Road) Footpath Diversion Order, 1955.
