On the 6th April, 1955, at Hohne in Germany there was a premature explosion in the 25 pdr. gun of one of the Armoured Fighting Vehicles of "K." Battery of the 5th Regiment, Royal Horse Artillery. The detonation tore the gun from its carriage, killed one member of the gun detachment, and seriously injured the other, Bombardier Porter. The camouflage net burst into flames filling the shattered fighting compartment with burning fragments.
Battery Sergeant Major LADD shouted "Fire", called for extinguishers and ran immediately to the rescue, although he well knew that there were live shell and unfired cartridge bags at the gun. With complete disregard for his own safety he climbed into the vehicle. He found Bombardier Porter lying on the bottom of the compartment, very seriously burnt and bleeding. He lifted out the injured man and passed him to safety in the hands of others. He then threw clear the live shell and cartridge from the surning vehicle. Although now choking with hands he gallantly fought the fire from burns on his hands he gallantly fought the fire from burns on his and throwing out smouldering pieces of equipment. Using extinguishers, single handed, he put out the induction of the vehicle until all danger was passed although now suffering from shock and canceled and throwing out smouldering from shock and canceled and throwing out smouldering from shock and throwing.

By his prompt and fearless actions B.S.M. LADD saved the life of Bombardier Porter and prevented danger to the lives of others and further damage to valuable equipment.
