"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of High Easter and the benefice of Margaret Roding both situate in the diocese of Chelmsford.

"1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of High Easter and the benefice of Margaret Roding shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of High Easter with Margaret Roding', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"4. Patronage. After the Union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of High Easter, having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."
