

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,

"(12) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of

Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of September, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Exchange of Patronage) Act, 1853, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1860, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the alternate right of the patronage of the benefice of Sherston Magna with Easton Grey, now vested in the Bishop of Bristol in right of his See, for the patronage of the benefice of All Saints, Bristol, now vested in the

Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity in Bristol (hereinafter called 'the said Dean and Chapter'), and we do hereby certify that we have made due enquiry into the respective circumstances and present values of the said benefices and that they are as set out in the Schedule to the said Scheme.

"SCHEME.

"With the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bristol, and the said Dean and Chapter (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), the alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Sherston Magna with Easton Grey shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the said Dean and Chapter, and in exchange for the same the right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of All Saints, Bristol, shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the said Arthur, as Bishop of Bristol, and his successors in the same See.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of September, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Castle Eden in the County and diocese of Durham.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that Edward Gibson of 7, Grey Street, in the City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Solicitor, John Walter Limbrey Sclater Booth of Te Whare, Hatch Lane, Old Basing, Basingstoke, in the County of Hants, Engineer, and Robert Courtenay Brooks of 76, Bounty Road, Basingstoke aforesaid, Solicitor, as Executors of the Will of the Honourable Mrs. Frances Mary Sclater Booth deceased are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice:

"And whereas the said Edward Gibson, John Walter Limbrey Sclater Booth and Robert Courtenay Brooks desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Durham for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have each executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur Michael, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Bishop of Durham and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Durham for the time being."
