

and Braithwell meet and extending thence southwards along the boundary which divides the parish of Ravenfield from the parish of Braithwell to the point where it meets the eastern end of the wall or fence which forms the southern boundary of close numbered 17 and extending westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and proceeding thence in the same direction to the eastern end of the stream or ditch which flows across close numbered 18 and extending thence generally westwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream or ditch thereby crossing closes numbered 18 and 51 to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 51 and proceeding thence northwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of close numbered 53 and proceeding thence westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of close numbered 56 to its end at Moor Lane and proceeding thence first westwards to and then northwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of close numbered 67 and proceeding thence westwards to and then along the last mentioned wall or fence and the walls or fences forming the northern boundaries of closes numbered 62 and 61 to the boundary which divides the parish of Ravenfield from the parish of Thrybergh and proceeding thence generally southwards along the last mentioned boundary to a point in the middle of Holling's Lane and proceeding thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the middle of the unnamed road or trackway, adjoining the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of close numbered 37, which leads from Holling's Lane to Central Avenue, and proceeding thence first to and then generally southwards along the middle of the last mentioned road or trackway to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the Football Ground being close numbered 334a and proceeding thence southwestwards in a straight line thereby crossing closes numbered 334, 333, 318 and 323 to the northeastern end of the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of close numbered 324 and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence first southwestwards to and then southeastwards along the middle of the unnamed lane (leading past the premises known as Woodlaithes to Flanderwell Lane) to its end and continuing thence first southeastwards to and then southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to its end and proceeding thence first southwestwards to and then southeastwards along the middle of Hill Top Lane to the point where it meets the boundary which divides the parish of Holy Trinity, Dalton from the parish of Wickersley and continuing thence north-eastwards, southeastwards and northeastwards along the last mentioned boundary and the boundary which divides the parish of Conisbrough from the parish of Wickersley to the northwestern end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of close numbered 284 and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence southeastwards along the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of close numbered 265 for a distance of 138 yards and continuing thence eastwards first to and then along the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as number 11 Sycamore Avenue from the house and premises known as number 13 Sycamore Avenue to its end and continuing thence northeastwards to and then generally eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned Avenue and the middle of Pear Tree Avenue to a point opposite the northern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as number 40 Pear Tree Avenue from the house and premises known as number 42 Pear Tree Avenue and proceeding thence southwards first to and then along the last mentioned wall or fence to the boundary which divides the parish of Wickersley from the parish of Braithwell.

#### "PART II

"(1) Territory to be annexed to the parish of Conisbrough:—

"All that part (coloured blue on the map) of the parish of Braithwell which lies to the northeast of the middle of the Braithwell and Thrybergh Junction branch line of British Railways (Eastern Region) and forms part of close numbered 108a.

"(2) Territories to be annexed to the parish of Maltby:—

"All those two parts (coloured brown on the map) of the detached part of the parish of Stainton which lie to the east of the Braithwell and Laughton branch line of British Railways (Eastern Region).

"(3) Territories to be annexed to the parish of Holy Trinity, Dalton:—

"(a) All that part of the detached part of the parish of Conisbrough (coloured green on the map) not included in the area described in Part I of this Schedule.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Ravenfield (coloured purple on the map) lying to the southwest of Holling's Lane and not included in the area described in Part I of this Schedule.

"(4) Territory to be annexed to the parish of Wickersley:—

"All that part (coloured red on the map) of the parish of Braithwell which lies to the south of the middle of Pear Tree Avenue and to the west of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house or premises known as number 42 Pear Tree Avenue."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Sheffield.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 1st day of September, 1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Marylebone and the benefice of Holy Trinity, Saint Marylebone, both situate in the diocese of London.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of benefices and parishes.*

"The benefice of Saint Marylebone and the benefice of Holy Trinity, Saint Marylebone, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Marylebone with Holy Trinity, Saint Marylebone' and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for all ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*

"Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend James Bruce Harington Evans if he is then the incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Marylebone shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.*

"The parish church of the parish of Saint Marylebone shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"4. *Registers.*

"The marriage registers current at the church of Holy Trinity, Saint Marylebone, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other of the records and muniments
