WATER CHARGES.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Boston, acting by the Council (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), are about to apply to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for an Order under section 38 of the Boston Corporation Act, 1930, for the purpose of authorising them to increase as from the 1st day of April, 1956, their maximum charge for the supply of water by measure with the limits set out in the Schedule hereto.

A notice explaining the effect of the Corporation's proposals will be found in the "Lincolnshire Standard" published on the 19th and the 26th November, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 3rd day of November, 1955, the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation modified and confirmed the County Council of Lincoln, Parts of Kesteven (Roads Restriction) (Bourne) Order, 1954.

The effect of the Order as modified (which may be inspected at the office of the undersigned), is to prohibit the riding of any pedal cycle on the under-mentioned footpaths in the Urban District of Bourne:—

1. Footpath from North Street to Meadowgate.
2. That length of the footpath known as Church Walk from a point adjacent to the Bourne Abbey Church Yard to its junction with South Street.
3. Footpath from Queen's Bridge, Eastgate to Bedehouse Bank.
4. Footpath from Ancaster Road to Recreation Road.
5. Footpath from Recreation Road to Hereward Street.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:—Cattle plague or rinder-pest (*pestis-bovina*), 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*), 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*), 1850; rabies, 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*), 1906; glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*), 1928 and parasitic mange (*psoroptes et sarcoptes scabiei equi*), 1948. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.
