Safety Convention

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (SAFETY CONVENTION COUNTRIES) (VARIOUS) (No. 2) ORDER, 1955

Made - - - - - 1st December, 1955
Laid before Parliament 6th December, 1955
Coming into Operation upon the date of publication in the London Gazette - 9th December, 1955

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 1st day of December, 1955.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 31 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention) Act, 1949 (12, 13 & 14 Geo. 6. c.43), it is enacted that Her Majesty, if satisfied that the Government of any country has accepted the Safety Convention, may by Order in Council make a declaration to that effect.

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the Governments of the countries specified in the Schedule to this Order have accepted the Safety Convention:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Her by the aforesaid section and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and doth hereby order, as follows:—

1. It is hereby declared that the Governments of the countries specified in the Schedule to this Order have accepted the Safety Convention.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention Countries) (Various) (No. 2) Order, 1955, and shall come into operation upon the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of September,

1955, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town, and the benefice of Saint Paul, Camden New Town, both situate in the diocese of London.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes.*

"The benefice of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town, and the benefice of Saint Paul, Camden New Town, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Luke, Osenev Crescent, with Saint Paul, Camden Square', and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*

"If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the Reverend Frank Hasell Smye shall be the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town, the union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said benefice, but if upon the said day the said benefice shall be vacant or shall have been vacated by the said Frank Hasell Smye and a new incumbent shall have been instituted thereto in his place the union shall take effect forthwith and the incumbent (if any) of the said benefice shall, with his consent, become the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.*

"The parish church of the parish of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"4. *Registers.*

"The marriage registers current at the church of Saint Paul, Camden New Town, shall be dealt with in accordance with section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of the united parish.

"5. *Parsonage House.*

"Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint Paul, Camden New Town, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"6. *Patronage.*

"With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Right Honourable Sir Robert Anthony Eden,
