Malling R.D.C. (Plaxtol path No. 18) Diversion Order, 1955.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 7th day of December, 1955, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the parish of Plaxtol.
