The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, section 7 of the Finance Act, 1936 and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz. :—

The Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 11) Order, 1955, which continues until March, 1957, the existing exemption from duty chargeable under the Import Duties Act, 1932, of the iron and steel goods specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Order; and exempts until 18th September, 1956, the iron and steel goods specified in Part II of the Schedule (all of which were previously exempted until 18th March, 1956, with the exception of plates and sheets in the form known as circles, which have hitherto been chargeable with duty).

The Order comes into operation on the 9th January, 1956, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1955, No. 1982.
