Notice of determination to modify particulars contained in draft rights of way maps.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Northamptonshire County Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sub-section (3) of Section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the draft rights of way maps and statements prepared under Section 27 of the above-mentioned Act in relation to the rights of way within the parishes specified in the First and Second Schedules hereto by the deletion of the public paths or roads used as public paths described in the First Schedule hereto and by the addition of the public paths or roads used as public paths described in the Second Schedule hereto. The said paths are shown on maps which have been deposited at the offices of the Boughton Estates Limited, Estate Office, Weekley, and which may be seen there free of charge between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and between 2.30 p.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays, other than Saturdays and public holidays, and between 9.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any representation or objection with respect to these determinations shall be made in writing addressed to the undersigned before the Eighteenth day of February, 1956, and shall state the grounds on which it is made.

Dingley	G.H.3 (part) ...	Footpath ...	From the Dingley-Market Harborough road, northwards via the drive to Dingley Hall, All Saints' Church and the Rectory and thence south-eastwards to its junction with G.H.2.
East Carlton	G.K.3	Footpath ...	From the Desborough-East Carlton road, south-eastwards to the East Carlton-Pipewell road at the north-eastern corner of Askershaw Wood.
	G.K.4	Bridleway ...	From its junction with G.K.6, south-eastwards skirting the northern boundary of Ash Coppice to the Middleton parish boundary.
Geddington	G.L.3 (part) ...	Bridleway ...	From the Oakley parish boundary at the farmyard opposite the school at Little Oakley, south-eastwards to a point about 45 yards south of Harper's Brook.
	G.L.16	Footpath ...	From the green lane known as Clay Dick, north-eastwards through Langley Quarter to the Brigstock parish boundary in Geddington Chase.
Grafton Underwood	G.M.1	Footpath ...	From its junction with G.M.2 near the Cranford parish boundary, north-eastwards to the Grafton Underwood-Cranford St. Andrew road at its junction with the Warkton-Slipton road.
	G.M.4	Footpath ...	From the Warkton-Grafton Underwood road, 250 yards east of Warkton parish boundary, eastwards to Grafton Underwood-Cranford St. Andrew road about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of Grafton Underwood village.
	G.M.5	Footpath ...	From the Grafton Underwood-Cranford St. Andrew road, opposite the terminus of G.M.4, north-eastwards to rejoin the same road at the south end of Grafton Underwood village.
	G.M.6	Footpath ...	From the village street, opposite the school, south-eastwards to the Grafton Underwood-Slipton road.
Gretton	G.N.18	Footpath ...	From the Gretton-Weldon road at the south end of Gretton village, adjoining the farm buildings known as Hunts Hovels, south-eastwards to its junction with G.N.16 and G.N.17.
	G.N.23	Footpath ...	From its junction with G.N.22 and G.N.24, east of the railway, north-eastwards to the Gretton-Weldon road.
Middleton	G.S.16	Bridleway ...	From the East Carlton parish boundary near the north-east corner of Ash Coppice, south-eastwards via Yokewood Lodge Farm to Oakley parish boundary south of Swinawe Barn.
Oakley	G.U.3 (a)	Bridleway ...	From its junction with G.U.3, north-east of Oakley Lodge Farm, north-eastwards to the Kettering-Rockingham road (A.6003).
	G.U.6 (part) ...	Footpath ...	From the south-east corner of Ash Plantation, north-eastwards to the Great Oakley-Little Oakley road.
	G.U.10	Bridleway ...	From the Little Oakley-Stanion road at the farm entrance opposite the school, southwards across the farmyard for a distance of about 35 yards to the Geddington parish boundary.
	G.U.12	Bridleway ...	From the Middleton parish boundary, south of Swinawe Barn, southwards to its junction with G.U.3.
Rushton	G.Y.8	Footpath ...	From the Rushton-Pipewell road at the south-west corner of Lady Mary Spinney, eastwards along the southern boundary of the Spinney to its junction with G.Y.2 at Rectory Farm.
	G.Y.9	Footpath ...	From the Rushton-Pipewell road at Towns Close Lodge, eastwards to its junction with G.Y.2 at the south-east corner of Alder Wood.
