CONSOLIDATION OF ENACTMENTS.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to section one of the Consolidation of Enactments (Procedure) Act, 1949 that, in order to facilitate the consolidation of the statute law of England and Wales relating to sexual crimes, to the abduction, procurement and prostitution of women and to kindred offences, and to make such adaptations of statutes extending beyond England and Wales as are needed in consequence of that consolidation, the Lord Chancellor intends on the 24th January, 1956, to lay before Parliament a memorandum proposing corrections and minor improvements in certain of the enactments concerned.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th January, 1956, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £250,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th January, 1956, to Saturday, the 4th February, 1956, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net

amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

Synthetic organic chemicals, analytical reagents, other fine chemicals and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes, the following:—

Diethylene glycol monomethyl ether (an ethylene glycol ether).

1-Phenyl-3-methyl-5-pyrazolone (a phenylmonomethylpyrazolone), of a purity not less than 99.0 per cent., and having a melting point of not less than 128° Centigrade.

Tetrachlorophthalic acid (a chlorophthalic acid).

Thymol (but not including *iso*Thymol).

Trifluoroacetic acid.

The Order which comes into operation on the 23rd January, 1956, is entitled the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) (No. 1) Order, 1956, and is published as Statutory Instruments, 1956, No. 46.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 21 (1) of the Finance Act, 1948, entitled The Purchase Tax (No. 1) Order, 1956.

The Order brings into force a new list of drugs and medicines which are free of purchase tax. The list supersedes the existing list shown in the Purchase Tax (No. 6) Order, 1954.

The new list comprises all substances and preparations exempted under that Order, but certain substances formerly classified by reference to their chemical names are now entered according to the name approved by the British Pharmacopoeia Commission. Such entries in the Schedule to the Order, others which appear for the first time and amendments to existing entries are printed in heavy type.

The Order comes into operation on the 23rd January, 1956, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1956, No. 27.
