"(4) Patronage.
"After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patrons of the benefice of Monkland having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"4. Alteration of boundaries

"With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Ebenezer Charles, being the incumbent of the benefice of King's Pyon with Birley, all that part containing Dorstone of the parish of Birley which by clause 4 of the said Order in Council dated the 7th day of May, 1929, is directed to be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Stretford upon the taking effect of the parish of the benefices of Monkland and parish of Strettord upon the taking effect of the union of the benefices of Monkland and Stretford, shall, upon the taking effect of the disunion recommended and proposed in clause 1 of this Scheme, be severed from the parish of Stretford and annexed for all ecclesiastical pur-poses to the parish of Birley."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied

"Whereas (the See being at present vacant) we have prepared this Scheme after consultation with the Right Honourable Sir Robert Anthony Eden, K.G., M.C., M.P., First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty during the vacancy of the See, and the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Bradford who have offered

Finance of the Diocese of Bradford who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said Right Honourable Sir Robert Anthony Eden, K.G., M.C., M.P., First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has also signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of Bradford or held in trust therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and

"Now therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, recommend and propose that upon and from the First day of January, 1956, all the endowments, securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule and all other if any the endowments belonging to or held in trust for the said Bishopric shall vest in us, the said Church Commissioners, pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit, rents and profit thereof upon and from that date:

day of March, 1956, an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,500 (or such greater sum or sums as we may from time to time determine) together with such further sums as we shall have been duly satisfied have been expended by the Bishop (I) in respect of the rent of and the rates on the house in which he shall with our approval reside and (II) in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop.

in an inventory to be deposited in the Diocesan
Registry of the Diocese of Bradford."
