The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 3) Order, 1956, which increases the rates of drawback of Customs duty allowable in respect of imported linseed oil used in the manufacture of certain kinds of exported goods, as follows:

(a) in the case of exported paints, printers' inks, floor coverings, fishing nets, etc., from £10 2s. 6d. to £11 2s. 6d. per ton; and

(b) in the case of exported linseed oil fatty acids, from £8 15s. 0d. to £9 17s. 0d. per ton.

The Order comes into operation on the 12th March, 1956, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1956, No. 307.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS, 1944 and 1947.**EXTINGUISHMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY.***Borough of Swindon.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in exercise of powers conferred upon him by section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, has made an Order extinguishing the public right of way over parts of footpaths between Akers Way and Rodbourne Road, Rodbourne Cheney, Swindon, and between the Moredon Power Station and Rodbourne Road, with effect from 9th March, 1956.

The rights of way to be extinguished are as follows:—

1. Commencing at a point (marked A on the map) 220 yards west of Rodbourne Road on the Industrial Estate Road, and continuing in a generally westerly direction for 910 yards to a point (marked B) where the path continues towards the Moredon Power Station.

2. Commencing at a point (marked C) 483 yards west of the aforementioned point A, and heading in a northerly direction for 16 yards, and then in a generally westerly and north westerly direction for 420 yards to a point (marked D) on the southern boundary of a playing field, where the path continues towards Akers Way.

3. Commencing at a point (marked E) 210 yards west of point A, and leading in a south easterly direction for 97 yards to a point (marked F) 407 yards from the junction of Rodbourne Road with the Rodbourne Road Bridge.
