INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950.

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6. Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following further amendments to the list published in the London Gazette of 17th June, 1955, of persons upon whom immunities and privileges have been conferred by the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges of the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation) Order, 1954, the said amendments taking effect
