The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of April, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Gabriel, Peverell Park, Plymouth, and Saint Pancras, Pennycross, both in the diocese of Exeter.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Exeter, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

“Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Gabriel, Peverell Park, Plymouth, and Saint Pancras, Pennycross, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

“THE SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Gabriel, Peverell Park, Plymouth:

“All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, which lies south of a continuous imaginary line which runs along the middle of Venn Lane, Burleigh Park Road, Burleigh Lane and Tor Lane.”

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

“As from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order there shall be transferred to the rural deanery of Martley in the Archdeaconry of Worcester the parish of Hallow now in the rural deanery of Worcester within the same archdeaconry.”
